

If you need help applying to college and/or for financial aid, or if you are interested in applying for a job and/or enlisting in the Military and need help with the next steps, please let me know. We will be working on scholarships in History and English class throughout the year. All seniors are eligible to apply for our Graduation Awards. More information is forthcoming.

Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors had a great time attending the College Consortium on September 19th and were able to speak with representatives from several colleges in and around WNY. The Titans XC teams are doing a phenomenal job this year and are off to a great start. Returning athletes on the boys' team are senior Grant Cornell, junior Ben Wedvik (ECS), junior James McAuley, junior Johnson Li, sophomore Ethan Learn, sophomore Collin Weber (ECS), freshman Kellen Hatch. Joining our team at the varsity level is junior Derek Ossont. Our girls' varsity team are all returning athletes: senior Kaylee Fox, senior Trinity Herman, senior Peyton Mest, sophomore Eva Green and freshman Genevieve Herman.

We began our season with our annual trail run at Allegany State Park followed by our first meet, the Red Dragon Invitational at Bemus Point Golf Course at which the boys' team took third place. The student athletes have made great gains so far; running farther in practices to lower their times for competition. They have already experienced the reward for their hard work and effort. At our non-league meet both boys' and girls' teams took first place!

On Saturday, September 27, the F/E Titans cross country team competed in the 60th annual McQuaid Invitational in Rochester, NY. The race included over 7,000 athletes from over 260 schools in New York State and across the country. Some schools traveled from California, Colorado, and Ohio as well as Ontario, Canada to compete in this amazing competition. This meet is one of our favorites and a great experience for the teams. Just as always, they performed very well at the McQuaid Invitational- great job, athletes!

As our season is fast approaching its completion, we have some very exciting league meets and invitationals still to come. On Saturday, October 11th we will compete in the 39th annual Bulldog Cross Country Stampede at Alden CSD; Tuesday, October 14th at Randolph Golf Course; and Friday, October 17th at Sunset Stampede at Evangola State Park. The season will wrap up with the CCAA Championships at Bemus Point Golf Course on Friday, October 24th followed by sectionals at Elma Meadows Golf Course on Friday, October 31st. It has been a very exciting and successful season so far and we are anticipating even more success as we finish our season.
