Community Service

Lauralton Hall is passionate about Community Service. Each year, our students are required to engage in meaningful work that uplifts the community. Seventy-five hours of community service are required for graduation.

Physics First Curriculum

All freshmen take Physics. The Physics First Program was developed in 2003 in coordination with Project ARISE with the goal of integrating the learning of science and math to develop confidence and passion to pursue careers in STEM fields. After completion, students continue to follow the PCB science sequence – Physics, Chemistry, Biology.

Advanced Placement Offerings

Enrollment is competitive – a numerical prerequisite must be met. Students are limited to 3 AP classes per year in junior and senior years. With approval, students may be granted permission to enroll in 4 AP classes. Students enrolled in an AP class are required to take the College Board AP exam in the spring.
