NOHS was established in 2004 as a public, rural, comprehensive high school. Curriculum & Grade Reporting

Schedule

The school year includes:

- Two 18-week semesters (4x4 Hybrid Block).
- Four 90-minute periods each day.
- Grade-level courses meet daily.
- AP level and support level courses typically meet every other day for the entire academic year.
- All students must take four credits per semester.

Grading System & GPA Calculation

AP and Dual Enrollment classes may be awarded a 10% weight based on state criteria. Honors/Accelerated classes are awarded a 5% weight when calculating the "Weighted GPA." No additional points are added to the final averages that appear on transcripts for AP, Dual Enrollment, or Honors classes.

Work-Based Learning

Work-based learning placements represent the pinnacle of the Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education experience. WBL is designed for students with a specific career focus related to courses (2) in a career pathway. Students work at an approved worksite related to career courses for part of the school day; their own transportation must be provided. Credit is issued for 1.0 and 2.0 Carnegie units per semester based on the student's assessed performance. Students must obtain minimum work hours based on the number of class units being earned:

- 1 block: 7.5 hours/week for 1.0 unit
- 2 blocks: 15 hours/week for 2.0 units

The North Oconee Literary Team has been named Georgia AAAA State Champions for three consecutive years.
