FROM THE PRINCIPAL: THE YEAR IN REVIEW



Dear Regina Dominican Friends,

Greetings from Regina Dominican High School, where we are thriving! The 2024-25 school year brought many successes and new adventures for your younger Panther sisters.

Regina students once again this year accomplished more, adventured more, stretched themselves more, and made us proud.

I am excited to share the exciting news that Regina Dominican has been awarded the Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Award! The multi-step application process required us to provide evidence of our students' academic achievement as well as extensive documentation about our curriculum, mission, school culture, and faculty. We

have been bursting at the seams to share this news with our entire community, and especially with you. We will be celebrating this accomplishment all year long, and hope you can share in some of the festivities.

A few of the other highlights of the last year from my perspective are:

We took three RDHS students to New York City to participate in the UN International Day of the Girl. Our students spent the day on the floor of the UN interacting with each other and with diplomats, and engaging in conversation and debate about topics of importance to girls and women around the world. After the official program

ended, they were able to meet with a member of the diplomatic staff of the U.S. Ambassador to the UN. They even managed to fit in a trip to Broadway to see a performance of *Suffs*, the Tony-winning musical about the fight for women's suffrage.

Our athletic programs continued to demonstrate strength in every program. The entire cross country team qualified for the state tournament, our flag football team had an incredibly electric inaugural season and showed up tough and determined for every match, our basketball team won their third consecutive regional title, and **Jillian DeFranza '26** was the Independent School League Player of the Year. Our lacrosse team, under the coaching of **Lena Swabb '20** had the most players and the most wins since 2019. Our track and field 4 x 800 relay team were IHSA state finalists. Universally, our Regina athletes are routinely recognized and complimented on their academic stats and their sportsmanship with other teams' athletes.

On the Fine Arts front, I sure hope you got home to Regina to experience one of our two musicals this year, *Chicago* and *Six*, both of which showcased the powerhouse talents of our graduating Seniors, as well as the Orchesis dance company's spring show. Put these events on your calendar for next year and you will not be disappointed!

Academically, you can't beat having a record percentage of Illinois State Scholars in the Class of 2025, and college scholarship offers that averaged out to over \$480,000 per graduate. And for the second year in a row, Regina Dominican was named to the College Board's Advanced Placement Honor Roll at the Platinum level (the highest), putting us in the top 5% of all Illinois high schools.

Lastly, as a Catholic school core memory, nothing comes close to learning about the election of the new Pope during the school day, and then having an impromptu all-school celebration when we learned that Pope Leo grew up right here in our very own Archdiocese of Chicago!

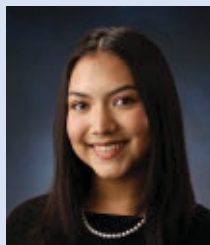

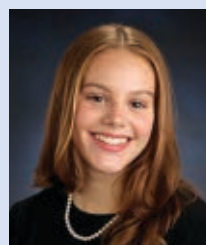
PRINCIPAL'S AWARD FOR SUPERIOR SCHOLARSHIP

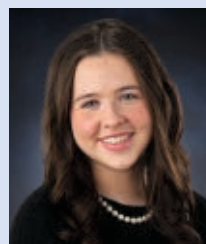

THE CLASS OF 2025

Regina Dominican joyfully celebrated the graduation of an inspiring group of young women whose achievements, leadership, and spirit have left an enduring mark on our community. Surrounded by proud families, friends, and fellow Regina Girls, we honored their many accomplishments and the legacy they carry forward.

We were especially honored to welcome back distinguished alumna **Judge Dalila Argaez Wendlandt '87** (shown to right), Associate Justice of the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court, as our keynote speaker. Judge Wendlandt shared five powerful life lessons that deeply resonated with our graduates:

- Speak your truth. Do not be afraid to show your identity.
- Be brave, not perfect.
- Assign yourself.
- "Effortlessness" is a myth.
- Use your voice to change the world.

Judge Wendlandt also told the audience: "What you say, what you write, what you think—it matters; there are real consequences to inaction and silence in the face of injustice. By asking questions,





learning, and using your voice, you can actively shape the direction of history. Justice is not a passive outcome but requires conscious effort.” Her words

powerfully reflected the values at the heart of a Regina Dominican education and served as both a reflection and a challenge to our graduates as they embark on their next chapter.

Senior speaker **Allison Buck '25** (below lower left) also delivered a moving tribute to the strength, love, and lifelong sisterhood shared by the Class of 2025. Her heartfelt message captured the unity, resilience, and joy that have defined their time at Regina. “I can honestly leave Regina saying that in 5, 10, or 15 years, if any of my old classmates reached out to me for help, I would do whatever they needed in a heartbeat.” Allison stated. “Yes, we have our differences, but getting

to see each other grow and flourish on such a personal level is not as common as we might think. I have had the privilege to watch the girls around me grow and come into who they are.”

The Class of 2025's accomplishments are nothing short of extraordinary.

Collectively, they were awarded over \$11.4 million in scholarships to colleges and universities across the country—a testament to their academic excellence, leadership, and dedication to service. This remarkable class also made Regina history, founding the school's first Robotics Team, the “Regina Riveters,” and setting new records in athletics, including state-level appearances in Cross Country, Basketball, and Track & Field.

In addition to Commencement, Regina Dominican held its annual Convocation ceremony on May 21, 2025. This beloved tradition recognized the academic and extracurricular achievements of the graduating class and celebrated the perseverance, talent, and Regina spirit that have prepared them for what lies ahead.

As they take their next steps, the Class of 2025 carries with them the strength of their Regina education, the bonds of lifelong sisterhood, and the unshakable confidence to make a meaningful impact in the world. We look forward to seeing the many ways they will lead, serve, and inspire—true to the legacy of Regina Dominican. ■

Celebrating A BANNER

The 2024–2025 school year was one for the history books at Regina Dominican High School, as students, faculty, and families celebrated a year marked by exceptional academic achievement and recognition. Regina Dominican was privately informed by the U.S. Department of Education that it qualified for recognition as a recipient **2025 National Blue Ribbon School**, one of the nation's most prestigious distinctions for academic excellence—a reflection of the school's curriculum, dedicated faculty, and outstanding student achievement.

Regina Dominican was one of only a small number of schools nationwide—and among very few Catholic high schools—to meet the rigorous criteria for this honor. This distinction reflects the school's unwavering commitment to academic excellence, including its AP Platinum Status from the College Board, which recognizes both high achievement and broad student participation in Advanced Placement coursework. Through a challenging curriculum filled with AP, honors, and dual-credit opportunities, Regina Dominican continues to

empower students to achieve at the highest levels and succeed well beyond high school.

"We are proud of the hard work and commitment of our faculty and the outstanding academic performance of our students, which led to our recognition with this award," stated Regina Dominican Principal Dr. Kassie Porreca. "The rigorous multi-step application process took many months to complete, and we were thrilled to receive the notification that we were to receive the Blue Ribbon award. It's a validation of our years of hard work to create an academically outstanding high school experience for our students."

This may be the last year of the National Blue Ribbon program. The DOE announced August 29 that it is discontinuing the program. Regina Dominican proudly celebrates this milestone as a lasting symbol of its tradition of excellence and its commitment to preparing young women to lead with confidence, integrity, and compassion.

In addition to Blue Ribbon recognition, there were more milestones accomplished during the 2024–2025 academic year!



For the second year in a row, Regina Dominican earned **AP Platinum Status** from the College Board, recognizing the school's commitment to offering challenging Advanced Placement coursework while supporting broad student participation and success. The Class of 2025 exemplified this excellence, earning a staggering **\$11.4 million in offered scholarships** to colleges and universities across the country. Additionally, 11 seniors were named Illinois State Scholars, underscoring the depth of academic talent cultivated at Regina Dominican.

This year also marked a milestone for our journalism program, as the school made its debut at the **IHSA Journalism State Competition**. **Caroline Golden '26** competed in the Advertising event, representing the school at the state level for the first time. Six students competed at sectionals in a variety of categories—including Newswriting, Review Writing, Editorial Writing, Infographics, and Yearbook Theme Development—earning impressive results and demonstrating the growing breadth and strength of Regina's academic programs.



The school's success extended beyond the classroom into a variety of competitive academic arenas. Eleven sophomore students from the AP U.S. History program advanced to the **Illinois History Day Competition** in Springfield, presenting six original research projects that highlight their scholarship and creativity. Representing Regina Dominican were **Christine Cerimele '25**, **Erin Foley '25**, **Helena Hancko '25**, **Judy Fabianski '25**, **Tori Lukic '25**, **Fiona Coffman '25**, **Francis Galutan '25**, **Miranda Thomas '25**, **Jackie Heneghan '25**, **Kourtney Schuenzel '25**, and **Jana Tayara '25**.

Mathematics excellence remained a hallmark of the school as well. The Algebra I Freshman Mathletes team qualified for the **Illinois Council of Teachers of Mathematics (ICTM) State Competition** at Illinois State University, continuing a five-year tradition of state-level representation. Team members **Caroline Heneghan '28**, **Teagan Jacobs '28**, **Bridget Scott '28**, **Julia Ingraffia '28**, **Niamh Byrne '28**, and **Isabella Hengge '28** exemplified Regina's culture of problem-solving, persistence, and collaboration.

From STEM to humanities, history to journalism, Regina Dominican students continue to distinguish themselves at every level. These accomplishments reflect the dedication of both students and faculty, the strength of a rigorous and supportive academic environment, and the enduring mission of Regina Dominican to empower young women to succeed in college, careers, and life. As the school celebrates this banner year, the community looks forward to even more success and excellence in the years to come. ■

CAMPUS *Ministry*

Regina Dominican High School's Campus Ministry Department had an inspiring and faith-filled 2024–2025 school year, marked by service, and a growing commitment to Dominican values. Rooted in the four pillars of Dominican life of prayer, study, community, and service, students lived out the school's mission in ways both meaningful and memorable.

Over the course of the year, Regina students completed an incredible 4,884.5 hours of service, giving back to their communities with heart and purpose.

This year also saw exciting growth in leadership within Campus Ministry. An impressive 35 students served as Dominican Preachers, the largest number in over five years. These student leaders were at the heart of spiritual life at Regina, helping to plan daily prayer, liturgies, and service projects. Dominican Preachers are not only active participants in Campus Ministry, they are role models of faith throughout the school community on a daily basis.

The Freshmen got a strong start to their Regina experience with their Dominican Charism classes, each of which helped plan a meaningful Stations of the Cross service during Holy Week. Continuing a beautiful tradition, Pat Tomich's Freshman class also burned palms for the Ash Wednesday Mass, connecting ritual with reflection in preparation for the Lenten season.

One of the year's spiritual highlights was the Kairos retreat, held once again at the peaceful Bellarmine Retreat Center. The entire Junior class participated, guided by nine senior leaders who brought wisdom and warmth to the experience. Fr. Peter and Fr. Bret joined students on the final day for Mass and Reconciliation.

Freshmen also had the unique opportunity to travel to Adrian, Michigan, to visit the Adrian Dominican Sisters and learn more about the founders of our school and our Dominican heritage. Students gathered for a special dinner with

several of the Sisters, building intergenerational community and witnessing the legacy they are now part of.

The spirit of the Dominican tradition was also recognized through the Veritas Awards, given this year to Heidi Eichler and **Vera Yablonicky '25** for their outstanding commitment to living Regina's core values.

In February, Dominican Preachers represented Regina at the African American Heritage Prayer Service, celebrating diversity and unity through prayer and reflection. This summer, two students also attended the Dominican

Youth Movement's Summer Preaching Conference in Adrian, Michigan.

As the Campus Ministry Department continues to thrive, one thing is clear: the young women at Regina Dominican are not only learning about faith, they're living it boldly. Through prayer, service, and community, the 2024–2025 school year was a true reflection of what it means to walk in the footsteps of St. Dominic and St. Catherine of Siena. INCREDIBLE TALENT

The Regina Dominican Fine Arts Department showcased another year bursting with creativity, talent, and show stopping performances! The year kicked off with a “bang” as students brought the iconic musical *Chicago* to life. From dazzling choreography to bold vocals and standout performances, the production showcased the incredible range and dedication of Regina’s student artists, musicians, and crew.

Throughout the year, the Music Department hosted a variety of concerts that highlighted the incredible talent of Regina students in both choral and orchestral performance.

“This school year started off with a larger-than-life production of *Chicago* that set us up for a successful year in the Fine Arts!” said Noah Pligge, Music and Theater Teacher. “The tech theatre classes, led by **Sarah Anichini '25**, constructed a set beyond imagination. Band and choir presented multiple concerts featuring soloists from our Tri-M Music Honor Society. And we even ended the year with an additional musical performance of *Six*, which showcased just how talented the students in our program truly are!”

The Regina Dominican Orchestris Dance Showcase, *PRISM*, dazzled audiences with three spectacular performances on Friday, February 28, and Saturday, March 1. Featuring a total of 73 dancers, the show was a vibrant celebration of movement, color, and creativity.

Orchestris, Regina Dominican High School’s dance company, presented an unforgettable evening of choreography, showcasing a variety of dance genres including ballet, modern, jazz, contemporary, hip-hop, tap, and Irish dance.

Led by Regina Dominican Dance Teacher and Orchestris Director Ally Valadez and Assistant Director Katie Lyons,

with support from senior captains **Allison Buck '25** and **Abby King '25**, Orchestris delivered a performance brimming with talent and energy. A majority of the dances were student-choreographed, highlighting the remarkable creativity and talent of the dancers themselves. The showcase also included a few director-choreographed pieces, as well as a special guest-choreographed piece by Fernando Rodriguez of Giordano Dance Chicago.

"This year was a busy one for our Orchesis dancers at Regina! This year's Orchesis Dance Concert theme was *PRISM*, which featured music and dances inspired by color," said Orchesis and Dance Teacher Ally Valadez. "Our *PRISM* performance in March showcased a variety of dance genres, including ballet, modern, jazz, contemporary, hip hop, tap, and Irish dance. Outside of our annual concert, Orchesis dancers also had the opportunity to perform at various community events such

as the Wilmette Block Party, the St. Paul of the Cross Gala, school-wide pep assemblies, and the Illinois High School Dance Festival. We also hosted two on-campus dance clinics for prospective 5th–8th grade students to come and learn more about dance at Regina!"

The Art Department collaborated with the Music Department for this year's Art Showcase. The event featured an impressive collection of artwork across a variety of mediums, including drawing, painting, sculpture, and mixed media. From detailed pencil portraits to bold acrylic canvases, each piece reflected

the individuality and imagination of our student artists. The showcase not only highlighted the technical skills developed throughout the year but also gave students a platform to share their voices and vision with the school community.

Ending the year, was the Regina Dominican Spring Musical production of the new hit musical "Six". This incredible performance brought energy,

empowerment, and history to the stage as students reimagined the six wives of Henry VIII through bold songs and dynamic performances. 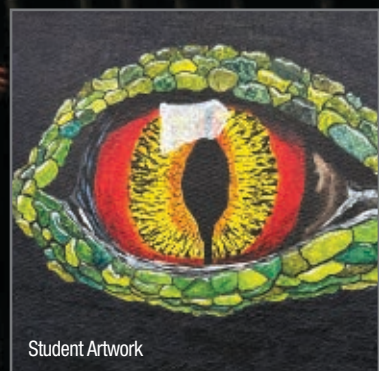

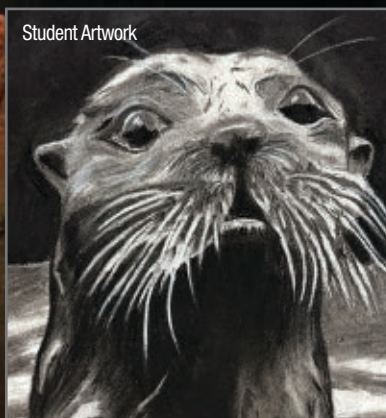

LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE HIGHLIGHTS



READY, SET, DESIGN: INNOVATION COMPETITION '25

With a focus on entrepreneurship, the junior level Leadership Scholars were given a design challenge to create a winning phone app to help solve everyday problems. On April 23, six teams participated in Regina's annual spring competition. Classes on design, ideation, research and pitch development through creative problem solving (CPSI) helped prepare students for the challenge. A lecture by New Yorker cartoonist and creativity consultant, Pat Byrnes, was a highlight and launched the ideation module. Vying for "most likely to invest" and "most likely to buy" titles, student teams set up tables to pitch product wireframes and share more about their prototypes.

Junior Leadership Scholars "phone app" projects were:

- **Tech Tutor** provides 24/7 tech support with simple explanations and videos.
- **Glam Scout** finds dresses by scouring websites to find the perfect dress. Glam Scout has the capability for users to buy and sell dresses that reduce fast fashion.
- **Mood Mosaic** tracks mood with a colorful mandala connected to mental health strategies and support.
- **Parkify** scans parking lots to find an open space with a bonus car finder option.
- **Perspective News** compiles news from multiple perspectives, with a bias search feature.
- **Style Genie** scans subscribers' closets to pick the perfect outfit.

LESSONS IN LEADERSHIP

Imagination and effort filled the halls fourth quarter as students shared-out their capstone learning projects for the 2024-2025 leadership theme of Joyful Learning. Over 100 students took the controls for their own learning experiments, leaning into areas of interest ranging from suturing and sewing to cryptography, memorizing capitals in Europe, baking gluten free, and guitar duets!

As alumnae **Bridget Thoreson '03** wrote in her July *Career River* series about what it means to start something new, "First, it will be horrible." (mycareerriver.com) Despite the often rocky start of learning something new, Regina students had the benefit of specialized assessments, workshops, and extra encouragement to illuminate the process. Workshops covered the benefits of growth mindset, smart risk taking, learning styles and approaches, identifying positive influences, failure as a first attempt in learning, and much more! Interactive opportunities in teams and pairs allowed students of every grade to expand their leadership skills and capacity around the theme of joyful learning. Applications are reviewed by members of the NIAAA QPA committee.

INSPIRING *Generations*

The Life and Legacy of Sister Marion O'Connor, 1930–2025

For over half a century, Sister Marion O'Connor, OP, shaped the hearts and minds of Regina Dominican students with her intellect, integrity, and unfailing dedication to education. Beloved teacher, mentor, and friend, S. Marion passed away on July 13, 2025, at the Dominican Life Center in Adrian, Michigan, at the age of 95, in the 76th year of her religious profession as an Adrian Dominican Sister.



S. Marion's impact reached far beyond academics. For decades, she served as Senior Moderator, orchestrating Ring Day, Prom, Honors Convocation, and Graduation with her characteristic attention to detail and care for each student. She celebrated her students' accomplishments as if they were her own and was a constant, guiding presence through their most formative years.

Born in Chicago in 1930 to Jeremiah and Mary O'Connor, S. Marion attended Aquinas High School before earning a bachelor's degree in history from Siena Heights College and a master's degree from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. Upon entering the Adrian Dominican Congregation, she became known as S. Ellen Michael and soon began her lifelong vocation as an educator. After seven years teaching in Michigan, she began what would become her life's work: over 50 remarkable years at Regina Dominican High School in Wilmette.

S. Marion led the Social Studies Department for 37 years and set a standard of excellence that inspired both colleagues and students. Known for her "no-nonsense" approach, she demanded

that each student work to her fullest potential, yet she was always ready to offer guidance and support. Her classes extended far beyond the textbook, with lessons brought to life through unforgettable experiences: from trips to the Criminal Court Building at 26th and California to European tours that opened the world to her students. She founded the school's first Advanced Placement courses and championed civic engagement, ensuring her seniors served as election judges as soon as they were old enough to vote.

To her colleagues, S. Marion was both a leader and a friend. Mike and Tina Small, who joined Regina in 1978, recall how quickly she became part of their family. "She treated all her teachers

with respect and motivated us by her example of hard work and taking responsibility for your decisions," Mike remembers. Her wry sense of humor and openness to fun, even laughing later about the time a prank left her setting off a courthouse security alarm, endeared her to all.

Dr. Kathy Burke '64

recalls their shared love for Chicago, whether trying new restaurants, attending concerts at Millennium Park, or hosting local judges at Regina for the Legal Issues Seminar. S. Marion's professional dedication was unmatched. She spent summers at AP seminars, mentored colleagues, and even in "retirement," offered advice and encouragement as a trusted presence outside the Senior Lounge.

At the peak of her career, S. Marion was often called "the Face of Regina," and those who knew her best believe that title will never fade.

Her life's work embodied the Dominican charism of Veritas, truth, through her teaching, mentorship, and unwavering commitment to the Regina Dominican community.

S. Marion leaves behind a legacy of excellence, faith, and love that will continue to inspire generations of Panthers. She will forever remain the "Face of Regina" in the hearts of her students, colleagues, and all who were blessed to know her. ■

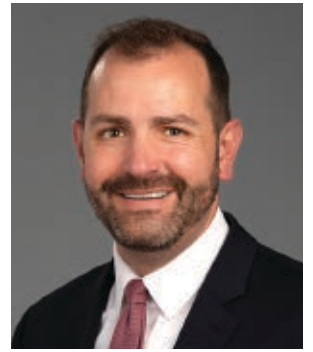

This year, eight graduates from the Class of 2025 walked across the stage as legacy students, proudly following in the footsteps of their mothers, who are Regina alumnae. In many of these families, the bond goes even deeper: sisters, cousins, and younger daughters have also chosen Regina, creating a beautiful chain of tradition and trust that spans decades.

Legacy mothers and sisters were invited to take part in two very special celebrations at the end of senior year. Just a few days before graduation, Regina hosted its annual alumnae induction ceremony, where mothers and sisters who are Regina alumnae were invited to officially welcome their daughters and sisters into the alumnae community by presenting them with their Regina pins. The morning began with a joyful breakfast, giving legacy families a chance to gather, reminisce, and celebrate

this meaningful milestone together.

Then, at graduation, many of these Regina moms took the stage once again, this time to present their daughters with their diplomas. In addition, alumnae sisters were invited to walk alongside their graduating sisters as they crossed the stage. It's a cherished tradition at Regina, reserved for our alumnae, and it brought tears and smiles alike as generations stood side by side in celebration of a shared legacy.

There is something uniquely powerful about attending the same school as your mother; walking the same halls, singing the same loyalty song, and learning in a community built on shared values. These mother-daughter pairs have experienced Regina across different generations, but the heart of the school, the sisterhood, the spiritual foundation, and the commitment to academic and personal growth remain constant.

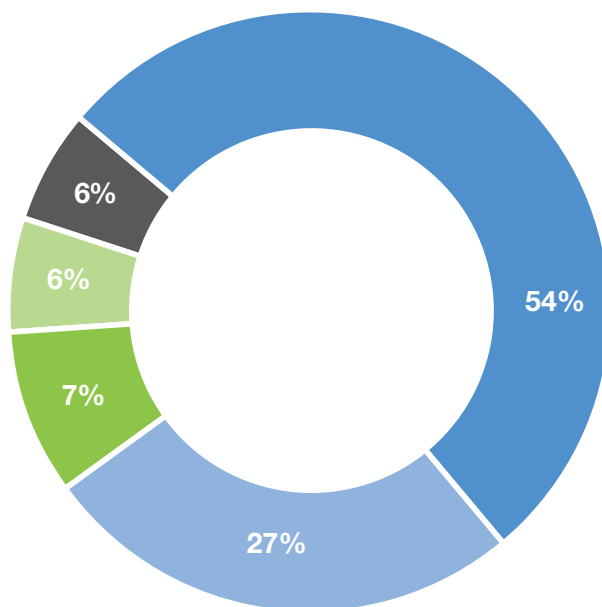

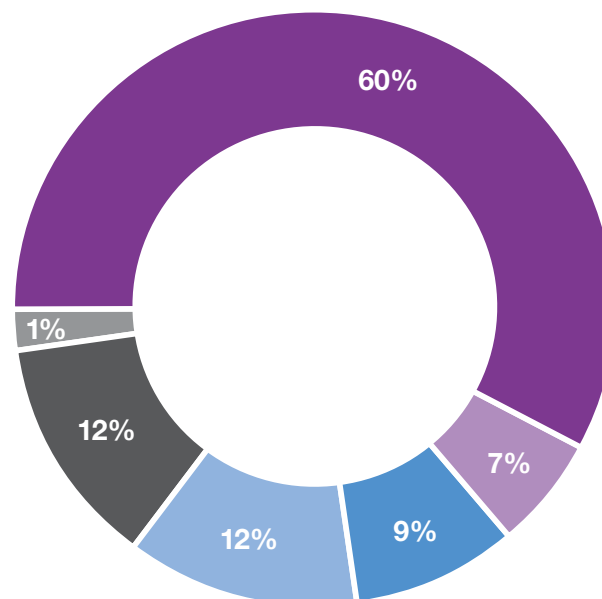
