What is Title I?


KCISD is a schoolwide Title 1 program that is designed to upgrade the entire educational program to improve the achievement of our students.

-Eligibility

Having not less than 40% of the children enrolled in the school are from low income families

-Requirements

Campus Improvement Plan, Parent and Family Engagement Plan, School-Parent Compact, and Surveys/Evaluations



-Funding


Being a Title I, Part A school means receiving federal funding (Title I, Part A dollars)

to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars can be used for...

- Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the State's challenging content standards**
- Purchasing supplemental: staff, programs, materials, and supplies**
- Conducting parent and family engagement meetings, trainings, and activities.**

Parent Rights

Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) ensures parents have specific rights regarding their children's education, particularly in schools receiving Title I funds.

These rights include being involved in the development and implementation of school and district-level parent and family engagement policies, receiving information about their child's academic progress and assessments, and having opportunities to participate in school decision-making.




