Location: Ben Hill County Middle School

Enrollment: 60 students

Academic Teacher-Student Ratio: 1:10

Did You Know...

According to our 2024 grant data ...

- **Ben Hill County has the largest number of public housing facilities in the state of Georgia per capita, due to our high poverty ratio.**
- **The county has almost, 1,000 residents receiving SSI benefits, well over 100 in the school system.**
- **Violent crime rate in Ben Hill is 35, which is significantly higher than US average of 22.7**
- **Property crime rate in Ben Hill is 82.5, nearly double the national average of 35.4**
- **Low educational attainment in the area: 5.38% have less than a 9th grade education; 11.21% have a 9th-12th grade education; 50.43% have a high school diploma; 22.86% have some college degree; 8.08% have an associate degree; 8.07% have a bachelor's degree; and 3.12 % have a graduate degree or higher.**
