

Curriculum Committee Meeting Minutes 10/13/25

Members Present: Kim Hunt, Kyley Hill, Amy Listenik, Monica Stearns, Tina Lowe, Stephanie Sweet, Nancy Guyette

Kim asked for nominations for Committee Chair. Tina nominated Stephanie and there were no other nominations so the group voted unanimously for Stephanie. Kim asked for nominations for minute taker. The group asked Tina if she wanted to continue doing it, but she asked for other volunteers. Amy agreed to take it on with the understanding Tina would help out when Amy can't be there. The committee unanimously approved this.

Kim talked to the group about goals for the year. Her thoughts were 1: Provide oversight on performance data and provide reports for the Board; 2: Provide oversight on AI best practices and provide reports for the Board; 3: Discuss and approve the new courses that will be brought to the group for the coming year.

The group discussed these goals. Stephanie asked about using AI for minute taking, but there were mixed reviews from those who have used it about its accuracy. Kim has asked grades 7-12 staff about their feelings on using AI in the classroom. There is still a long way to go and lots of unanswered questions. Students need to learn about AI and the benefits versus the potential problems. Teachers will have to monitor the process so students aren't taking short cuts or cutting corners.

Kim told the group they have formed an AI Advisory Committee consisting of two teachers and two students as well as some of the administration who will work together to bring updated information about AI to light and help teachers and students learn more about it. Kim said the State is working on policies regarding AI which will hopefully come out in the spring.

Kim shared that they are still working to streamline the elementary school report cards to make them less "wordy". Kyley pointed out that teacher comments are one of the most important parts of a report card for students and families. The group agreed that comments and periodic updates about your student would be a great goal for teachers with the understanding that time is obviously sometimes a hurdle.

There was no new business. Meeting was adjourned at 5:44 pm.
