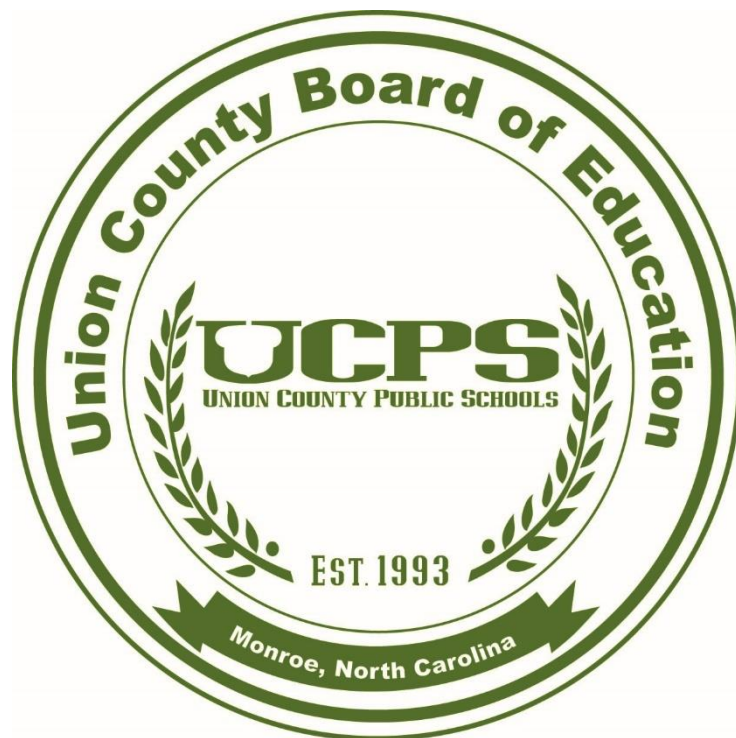

BUDGET EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND MESSAGE TO THE UNION COUNTY COMMUNITY

On Tuesday, May 3, 2022, the Union County Board of Education unanimously approved the 2022-2023 proposed operating and capital budget as presented. This proposal fully supports our 41,000 plus students and 5,000 employees.

There are many factors that are considered when developing a budget for a system our size. As one of the highest performing school districts in North Carolina, we must continue to support programming and resources that prove to be effective, and that will further position our students and teachers to be successful. We must also evaluate where improvements are needed and make adjustments to ensure success throughout our county as the largest employer and 6th largest district.

The COVID-19 pandemic presented new and unique challenges for Union County Public Schools staff and students. We are extremely proud of our teachers, principals, students, administrators and staff, and appreciate their resilience during this difficult time. Our collective efforts have been extremely successful and are a true example of the dedication of Team UCPS and our stakeholders.

As we look to the 2022-2023 school year, the Budget Recommendation is outlined in four categories that support Strategic Plan 2022. The areas of focus are:

- **Sustaining Operations**
- **Investing in Employees**
- **Program Expansion / New Initiatives**
- **Investing in our Future**

The approval of the recommended budget will continue to move UCPS in the right direction, and will align with our goal of establishing UCPS as the best school system in North Carolina.

An area of continued concern, especially due to the additional demands from the pandemic, is the need to increase local efforts for school personnel compensation. The teacher compensation package in North Carolina has declined relative to other states, adversely affecting our ability to recruit and retain quality teachers. The General Assembly did take positive action in the 2022 / 2023 budget to increase non-certified employee salaries and teacher compensation; but we also must do more at the local level.

Our 2022-2023 budget proposal seeks to increase the local compensation packages / supplements to support our most experienced teachers and assistant principals. The Board of Education's budget proposal also includes funding for compensation market adjustments for two employee groups:

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In compliance with federal law, UCPS administers all educational programs, employment activities and admissions without discrimination against any person on the basis of gender, race, color, religion, national origin, age or disability.



Skilled trades in our Facilities Department and Teacher Assistants. The funding requested for these adjustments will help UCPS stay competitive within the local and regional markets.

The budget recommendation also includes funding needed to sustain current operations as follows:

- Inflation adjustments for annual facilities and technology needs
- Projected increases to property and liability insurance
- State increases in certified and non-certified salaries
- State health and retirement matching benefits
- Required increase for the charter school pass through payments
- Stipend payments for high school cross country and indoor track coaches
- Year one implementation of the Middle School athletic program (three year phased in plan)

Capital funding for aging facility needs continues to be a top priority. The recommended capital budget and capital improvement plan addresses and prioritizes the renovations and repairs needed across the district. The capital request also includes items to address district technology needs, vehicle replacements and funding for year five of our band uniform and equipment replacements.

The students, school administration and staff of Union County expect and deserve the very best public school system in the state of North Carolina. In order to meet this expectation, we need funding to address the needs of the district as outlined in this request.

As Superintendent and Board of Education, we humbly submit the Union County Public Schools 2022-2023 budget recommendation for your consideration.

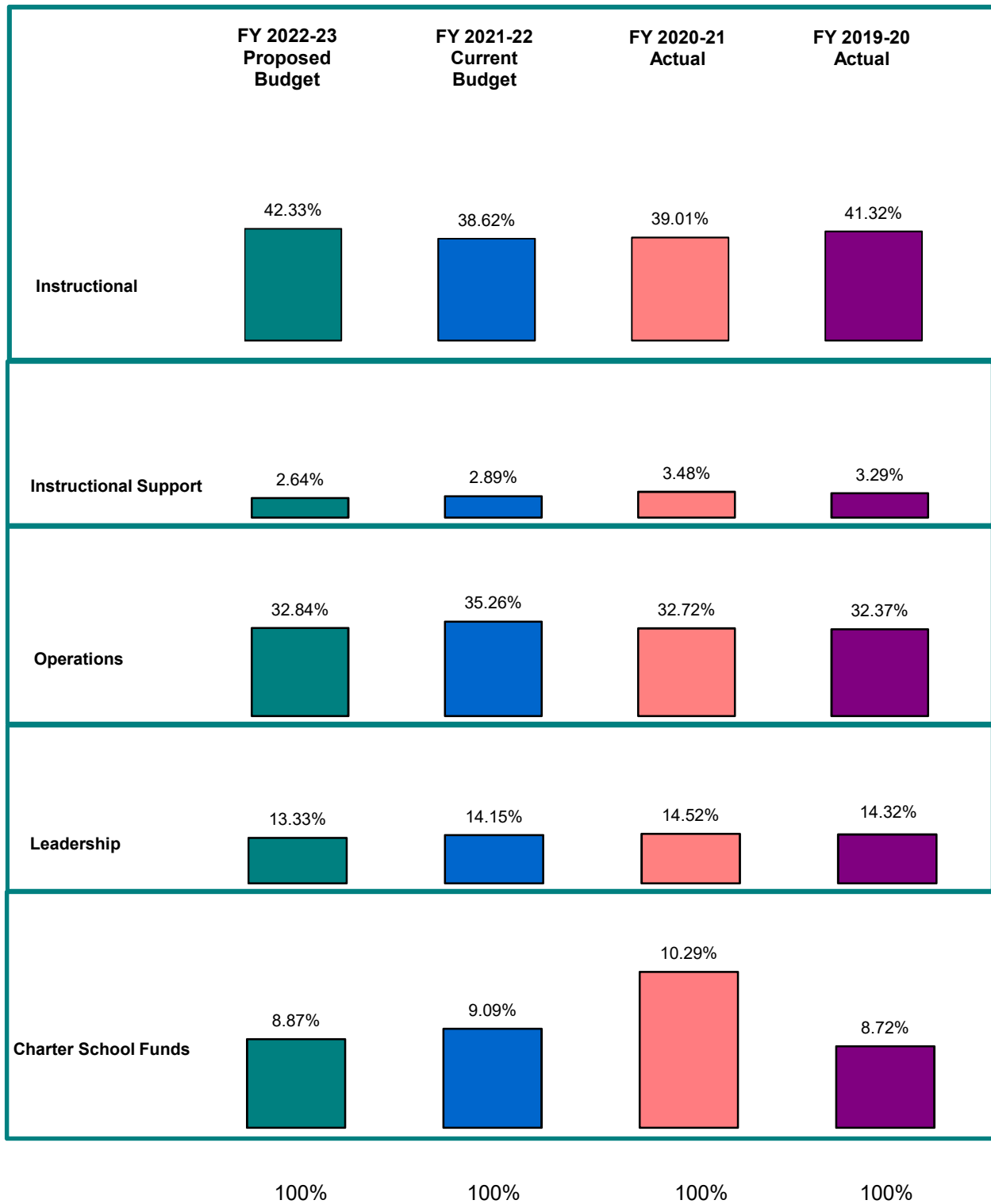
