## A GOOD NIGHT'S SLEEP & BEING ON TIME

A good night's sleep helps little ones wake up happy and ready for the day, making those morning routines a bit smoother. When children are well-rested, it's easier for families to get to school on time and start the day positively. Here are some things to keep in mind:

- Create a Consistent Bedtime Routine. Create a consistent bedtime routine by having the same bedtime each night and including calming activities like a bath, brushing teeth, and a story to help children fall asleep faster and wake up on time.
- Set an Early Bedtime. Preschoolers need 10–12 hours of sleep; an early bedtime makes morning wake-ups calm and prevents rushing or being late.
- Limit Screens Before Bed. Turn off TVs, tablets, and phones at least 1 hour before bedtime because screens make it harder for children to relax and fall asleep.
- Create a Calm Sleep Environment. Keep the bedroom dark, quiet, and cool; soft night-lights, white noise, or a favorite stuffed animal can make children feel safe and cozy.
- Avoid Sugar and Caffeine in the Evening. Chocolate, soda, and sugary snacks can make it hard for children to settle down.
- Encourage Relaxing Activities Before Bed. Reading, drawing, gentle music, or quiet play help their bodies and minds slow down.
- Wake Up at the Same Time Every Morning. A regular wake-up time supports good attendance and helps children arrive at school on time.

## PARADE ROUTE/IMPORTANT DETAILS: PLEASE READ



A few highlights and important points regarding the parade route, as shown to the left:

- 1. The pink rectangle identifies the **START** spot of the parade
- 2. The **blue** rectangle identifies the **END** sport of the parade
- 3. The *orange* line shows the parade route
- 4. The purple line (with stars a start to indicate the start and end spots) is where families can set up to enjoy the parade

<u>Friendly Reminder:</u> October 31st is a 4-hour day with dismissal at 12:45 PM.

\*Please note that Y-Time will be closing at 4:00 PM on the 31st, as well.

## TRICK OR TREATING TIPS

These tips help ensure everyone has a fun and safe Halloween!

#### **Before You Go:**

- Choose costumes that are bright so children are visible to drivers
- Make sure costumes fit well to prevent tripping, and consider face paint instead of masks that can block vision



Carry flashlights or glow sticks to light the way

#### While Trick-or-Treating:

- Always walk on sidewalks and cross streets at crosswalks
- Stay in familiar, well-lit neighborhoods
- Travel in groups and supervise young children at all times
- Remind children to never enter a stranger's home or car

#### **Candy Safety:**

- Check all treats before children eat them
- Discard any unwrapped or homemade treats from unknown sources
- Be mindful of food allergies when sorting through candy

#### For Drivers:

- Drive slowly in residential areas and watch for excited children who may dart into the street
- Be extra alert when entering and exiting driveways

Looking out for our community strengthens us all. When we support each other, we build trust and resilience that benefits everyone. Small acts of kindness create ripples of positive change!


Also, please help me in congratulating **Ms. Hoffman's class** on being the recipient of the **Golden Can** award for most items raised!
