Students in Mindy Christianson's Intercultural Communication class at Fergus Falls High School are taking a field trip to visit the Adult Learning Center to gain insights on the lives of individuals with very different life experiences from their own. It will give both the high schoolers and the ALC students an opportunity to learn about each other's cultures and lives. The ALC has partnered with Fergus Falls High School on this program since 2014.

Many ALC students are multilingual learners are new Americans who are recent immigrants or have come to the area through refugee resettlement. The high schoolers will sit in on multilingual learner classes and witness individuals learning English language skills that will help to prepare them for employment or post-secondary education or training. They will also learn about the process of refugee resettlement and what it is like for refugees to be forced out of their homes and resettled in a new foreign home.

The high schoolers and ALC students will join in small groups to have conversations and learn about each other face to face. They will have opportunities to ask each other questions about their home countries and their own cultures. The high schoolers will have the opportunity to ask the adult students about their home countries and their experiences moving to a new country and the ALC students will be able to ask the high schoolers what it is like growing up in the United States.

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
