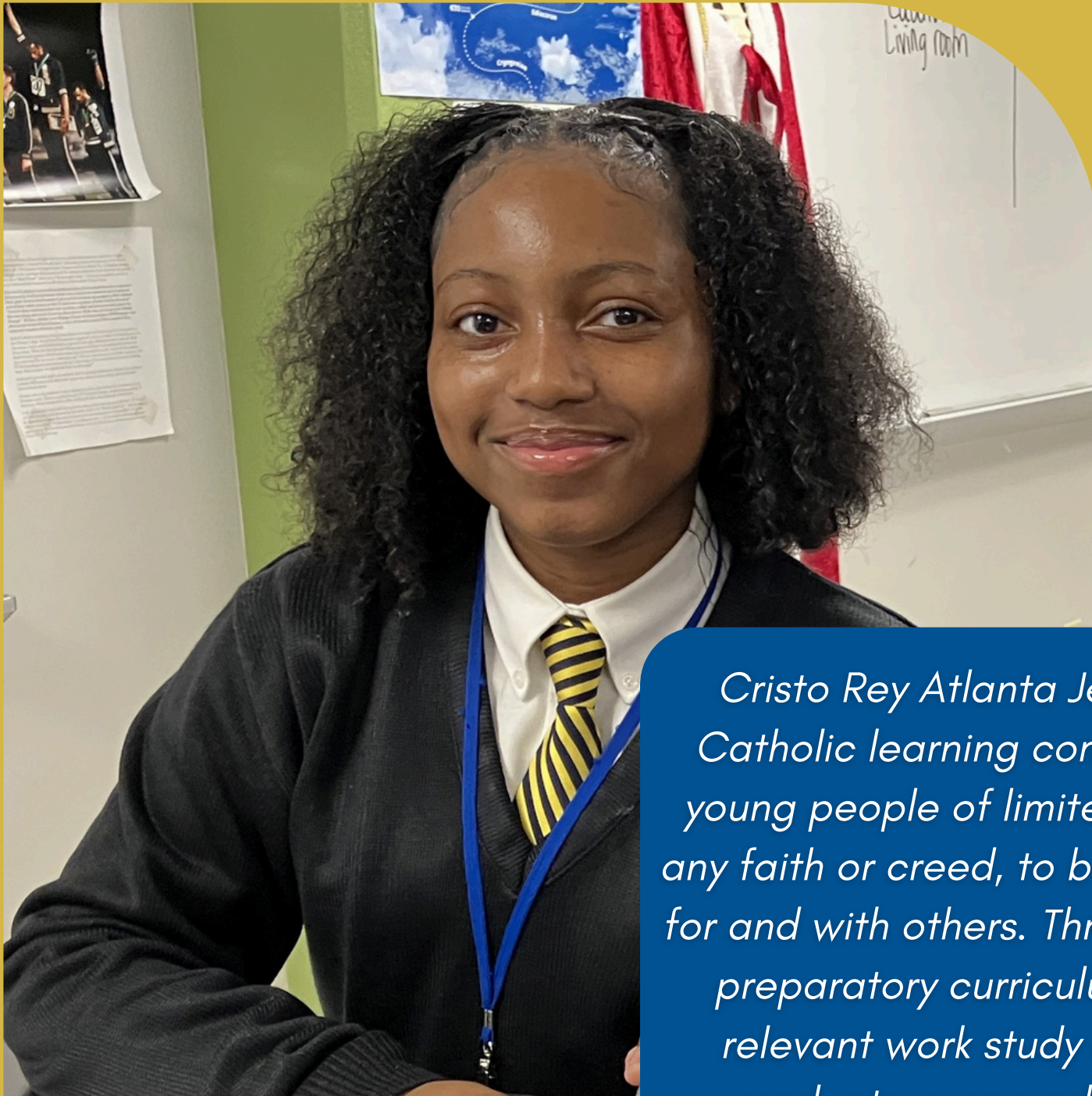

Our mission at Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School is to provide an outstanding college preparatory education and Corporate Work Study experience for students who would not otherwise have access to these opportunities. But we do not stop when our students walk across the stage to receive their high school diploma and matriculate to college. We commit to getting our students "To, Through, and Employed."

We have created a network of support for our alumni in college. We have two College Persistence Coaches whose job it is to check in with our Cristo Rey Atlanta alums at colleges all across the country to make sure they are on track for graduation, know where and how to access resources at their schools, and that they are doing well mentally and socially.

We have a Career Counselor who keeps alumni connected with our Corporate Partners for access to internship opportunities and job placement after graduation. Our Career Counselor ensures that alumni are thinking strategically and are tapping into the tremendous network of corporations and mentors who welcome our students into their offices.

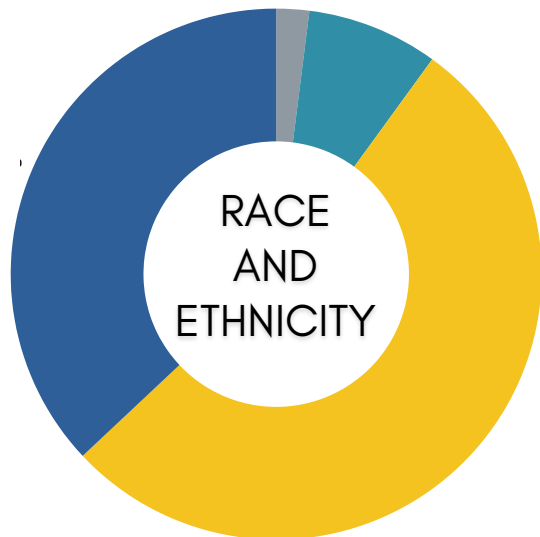

CORPORATE WORK STUDY PROGRAM

Education at Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School occurs both in the classroom and in corporate offices throughout the city. Through the innovative Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP), Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School students work 1 day a week at top local businesses. The earnings from this work pay for a large percentage of each student's tuition costs, giving them access to a rigorous, quality college-preparatory education that otherwise would be too expensive.

Cristo Rey students also gain valuable real-world job skills, contacts, and experience through their CWSP jobs. They go on to college in record numbers, in large part because of their early exposure to the working world.

Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit students do the hard work it takes to get accepted into elite universities across the country. They are matriculating to colleges like Boston College, Caltech, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth, Georgia Tech, Stanford, University of Georgia, University of Notre Dame, University of Pennsylvania, and Yale.

- 100% college acceptance for all eight graduating classes
- \$136 million in merit scholarship awards, not including Financial Aid
- 37 Questbridge Scholars, 17 Posse Scholars, 15 Chick Evans Scholars, 16 Madeleine Jude Brown Scholars, 10 Five Strong Scholars, 15 Horatio Alger Scholars, 10 Dell Scholars, and 5 Gates Scholars

Now alumni are coming full circle and returning to Atlanta where they are being hired by partners in our Corporate Work Study Program. These companies have shown true leadership by investing in our program and our students. Now they are realizing the benefit of that investment by hiring our exceptional alumni.

Endowments

Designated gifts to endowment funds help secure the financial future of Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit in perpetuity. Endowment funds are a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding. The school's General Endowment Fund supports the operational expenses of the school, and Named Endowment funds are determined by the donor and can be directed toward:

- student scholarships
- programming and academic excellence
- faculty and staff professional development
- Corporate Work Study experiences
- general operating expenses

Endowment assets are invested according to the school's Investment Policy. A portion of the value of the fund is paid out to support the fund's purpose each year once the fund has reached the corpus requirements. Any earnings in excess of this distribution are used to build the fund's market value, giving funds the chance to grow and provide support for its designated purpose in perpetuity.
