OUR DISTRICT GOALS

Reading: At the end of the 2026 school year, we will see a 3% increase in the percentage of students who are proficient and above on Georgia Milestone ELA assessments from the 2025 results.

Math: At the end of the 2026 school year, we will see a 3% increase in the percentage of students who are proficient and above on Georgia Milestone Math assessments from the 2025 results.

OUR SCHOOL GOALS

Improve student reading achievement as shown by a 3% increase in the median performance percentile from the Spring 2025 MAP assessment to the Spring 2026 MAP Assessment as well as a 3% increase in the number of students performing at proficient and above on the Spring 2026 Georgia Milestones Assessment. Improve student mathematics achievement as shown by a 3% increase in the median performance percentile from the Spring 2025 MAP assessment to the Spring 2026 MAP Assessment as well as a 3% increase in the number of students performing at proficient and above on the Spring 2026 Georgia Milestones Assessment.

- Student Progress Monitoring: Infinite Campus is an online resource that allows families to view grades, attendance, schedules, assessment, and your child's results, course history, and much more. Monitoring your child's progress in school is an important way to be engaged.
- **Communication**: We will communicate, to the extent feasible, all information with you in a language and format you understand. Whenever possible, we will provide interpreters during parent workshops, and academic events. Translation is available for most documents.
- **Transition Support**: Entering a new school can be scary for both students and families. We will host events to make sure both you and your child are aware of what is expected and how you can prepare as your child transitions to a new school level, college, and career.
