

Let's Celebrate Reading! We 💛 books!



CFISD Chromebook Weekand Device Check





What is it?

Chromebook Week and Device Check are designed to effectively track Chromebooks and ensure that the device receives all the required updates. In addition, students can submit support tickets for any issues they encounter with their devices.



Chromebook Week and Device Check will be the last full week in September, November, January, and March each school year. Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday will be the log-in days. Campuses choose the period or time of day.





What do we need students to do?

- Power off their devices and then turn them back on.
- Sign into their Google account and the student portal.
- Use the device for at least 15 minutes. Submit a support ticket if there are
- problems with the device.

What kind of issues require a support ticket?

- Cracked screen
- Touch screen not working correctly
- Device won't connect to the internet
- Headphones won't work when connected
- Cracks on lid or keyboard

- Missing keys
 Won't charge
 Lost charger/case/device





How can you help?

- Make sure that students bring their devices each day during Chromebook week.
- Help students follow the process of shutting the device down and then logging back into the device.
- Ask students if they have put a support ticket for device issues.


FAMILY APP INFORMATION

WHAT IS IT?

As part of the PBIS Rewards suite of apps, the free PBIS Rewards Family App allows parents and guardians to view student point totals, items purchased with points, and upcoming events for which points can be used.

HOW DO I GET CONNECTED?

Once you download the app onto a smartphone, you can scan a QR code to activate a student in the app. This QR code is unique to each student and is provided to the parent via a letter from the school. The app confirms the QR code, allowing the parent to access to their student's point totals and progress as the school year goes along.



Health Guidance for Going to School

CFISD



Showing up to school every day is critical for children's well-being, engagement and learning.

Make sure to send children to school if they are:

- · Generally healthy and well.
- Participating in usual day-to-day activities.
- · Children can even go to school if they:
 - Have a mild cold, which may include a runny nose and/or cough.
 - Have eye drainage without fever, eye pain or eyelid redness.
 - · Have a mild stomachache.
 - Have a mild rash with no other symptoms.
 - Have been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.

Avoid keeping children at home unless they are too sick to participate. Please see the back of this handout for details. Note that in most situations, a health-care provider's note is not needed to return, you can send a parent note.

Children may also avoid school due to anxiety (symptoms may include decreased appetite, feeling tired, stomachache, headache, etc). If you are worried that your child may be suffering from anxiety, talk with your child's teacher, the school nurse, counselor or other school staff to discuss the challenge and identify what can help your child stay in school.



Reasons to keep me home from school and what needs to happen before I can return

What is my symptom?	When should I stay home and when to seek medical care?	When can I return to school?	
Fever	I have a fever of 100.0°F or higher. Seek medical care if I have fever and any of the following: ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache or tooth pain.	If I have been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication and I am feeling better.	
Vomiting and/or diarrhea	If I have vomited 2 or more times in the last 24 hours. If my stool is watery and I may not make it to the toilet in time. Seek medical care if I have stomach cramping and fever, I have bloody or black stool, or I am showing signs of dehydration (tired and sleepy, dry mouth and not urinating at least once in the last 8 hours).	If I have not had vomiting and/or diarrhea in the past 24 hours and I am feeling better.	
Persistent cough or trouble breathing	Seek medical care if I have a persistent cough, difficulty breathing or trouble catching my breath or if I develop a fever with the cough. These symptoms may be signs of a serious or contagious illness that should be evaluated by a health-care provider.	Once I am feeling better and I have been cleared for return by my healthcare provider. If my symptoms were due to asthma, please make sure that I have my breathing medication available to use at school.	
Rash	Rash Seek medical care if the rash has blisters, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises and/or if I develop a fever Once my rash has healed or I have been cleared for return by my healthcare provider.		
Eye irritation	Eye irritation Seek medical care if I have eye swelling, eye pain, trouble seeing or an eye injury. Once I am feeling bette		
Sore throat Seek medical care if I have drooling, trouble swallowing or a fever and/or rash. been fever free for 22 fever reducing medical care prescribed an antibiod care provider, then I		Once I am feeling better if I have been fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication. If I was prescribed an antibiotic by my healthcare provider, then I may return 24 hours after the first dose.	

If you don't know whether to send your child to school or have specific concerns regarding your child's health, contact your child's health-care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse.






QUICK START GUIDE

DESIGNING YOUR AD ONLINE USING THE JOSTENS AD BUILDER



STEP 1 | GO ONLINE

Go online to **www.jostens.com/yearbookads** using the latest version of Chrome, Safari or Edge. Select your school and and select "Yearbook Recognition Ads" from your school's store.



STEP 2 | LOG IN

You will be prompted to log in to your account or create a new one. This is an important step since the email address you enter will be tied to your order allowing us to save your yearbook ad. From the login screen, you will be taken into the Jostens ad builder.


STEP 3 | SELECT YOUR AD

First, enter your student's name. Then, select the size and layout for your ad. If you have a pre-designed ad, select the "Upload your own design" ad layout option in your preferred size.



QUICK START GUIDE

DESIGNING YOUR AD ONLINE USING THE JOSTENS AD BUILDER



STEP 4 | UPLOAD IMAGES

Before you can place an image in your ad, you must upload them into the designer. Select "Upload" from the images tab on the left side of the screen to browse photos from your device. Make sure you use only high quality photos.

STEP 5 | EDIT IMAGES

Once your images are uploaded, you can drag and drop them into your layout. The ad builder lets you rotate, reposition and zoom in/out on your photos. Make sure your photo is just right before moving on.

STEP 6 | INSERT TEXT

Your student's name will be pre-populated with the information provided. Simply add your heartfelt message where the layout designates it should be. You can edit the font, alignment and size of your text. Remember to check your spelling!

STEP 7 | PREVIEW & BUY

Once you have finished designing your ad, select "Preview & Buy" in the top right of the screen. The designer will save your ad and you can review it one final time. Please take the time to read and acknowledge the disclaimers on the left, which may indicate your school has reserved the right to edit your ad (for example, if all the ads in the book must have the same font or a picture is deemed inappropriate). Once you are certain your ad is perfect, select "Purchase Ad".

Science Demonstration Program, AKA Demos

<u>Animal Friends</u>: Pre-K/ECSE (30 minutes). An assortment of live animals (such as a rabbit, bird, turtle, frog, snake or lizard) is used to introduce students to basic animal traits.

<u>Bunny Tales</u>: Pre-K/ECSE (30-45 minutes). This Demo is designed to combine a read aloud, discussions about the science connections within the text, and observations of a live rabbit. For the best experience for students, this Demo should be presented to one class (no more than two) at a time. Presentation limited to cooler weather months between October and April.

<u>Opossums</u>: Pre-K/ECSE (30 minutes). A stuffed opossum is used to demonstrate the special adaptations and characteristics of this Native American marsupial. Please limit these presentations to fall semester only.

<u>Guinea Pigs</u>: Kindergarten (30 minutes). A story, *Guinea Pigs Don't Read Books,* is read and discussed. A live guinea pig is shown. (Pig can be handled.) Please limit these presentations to fall semester only.

<u>Hedgehog Demo</u>: Kindergarten (30 minutes). *The Hat* by Jan Brett is read and discussed and a live hedgehog is shown. (Hedgy can be handled.)

Eggs and Nests Demo: 1st grade (45 minutes). Students observe a variety of eggs as they compare and contrast their physical properties. Children explore a bag of objects to discover if and how the items roll to discover why egg shape is important. A variety of bird nests are displayed for observation. Please limit these presentations to fall semester only.

Small Mammals: 1st grade (45 minutes). A live chinchilla is used to demonstrate its characteristics, behaviors and adaptations to the environment. Then students compare this mammal's adaptations to those of the hamster. (Animals are not handled.)

Body Coverings Demo: 2nd grade (45 minutes). A combination of live animals and teaching aids are used to describe the body coverings of fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. Featured animals include a lizard, tree frog, dove and hamster. (Animals are handled.) This was designed to go with the Undercover Lab for which materials are available from SRC.

<u>Insects</u>: 2nd grade (45 minutes). The insect's place in our ecosystem will be discussed. A sample insect collection will be shown along with live African hissing cockroaches. (Animals may be handled.)

Snakes: 2nd grade (45 minutes). Students review characteristics of reptiles and learn the unique adaptations of snakes. They will observe several live, non-venomous specimens and various teaching aids. Featured animals include the Trans Pecos rat snake, gray banded king snake and a coral mimic. (Animals are handled.)

Science Demonstration Program, AKA Demos

<u>Amphibians</u>: 3rd grade (45 minutes). A selection of live amphibians is available for close examination by the students. Various characteristics and interesting behaviors of amphibians are discussed. Featured animals may include the salamander, fire belly newt, gulf coast toad, clawed frog, siren and rococo toad. (Animals are handled.)

<u>Arthropods:</u> 3rd grade (50 minutes). Live and preserved specimens are used to compare and contrast characteristics of different classes of arthropods. Featured animals may include the millipede, tarantula, hissing cockroach, land hermits, a scorpion and pill bugs. (The millipede and hissing cockroach are handled.)

<u>Bird Structures:</u> 4th grade (50 minutes). Study skins will be used to illustrate the many unique characteristics and adaptations of this class of animals. Students need paper and pen or pencil.

Reptiles: 4th grade (45 minutes). A selection of live reptiles will be available for close examination by the students with a discussion of their various characteristics and interesting behaviors. Featured animals include the box turtle, soft shell turtle, red-eared slider, lizard, and corn snake. (Animals are handled.)

<u>CSI Cy-Fair:</u> 5th grade (50 minutes) Students solve a "who done it" mystery as they rotate through three station lab investigations analyzing fingerprints, fiber samples and chromatography samples.

<u>Mammal Skulls:</u> 5th grade (50 minutes). The volunteer discusses traits such as eye placement and tooth arrangement to provide clues for the students to guess the identity of common skulls. They will then be given the correct answer with a discussion of similarities and differences and identifying characteristics. Students need paper and pen or pencil.

Ecosystems: 6th grade (50 minutes). The volunteer brings a variety of live animals to link as a food chain, ultimately creating a food web. A power point presentation accompanies the lesson. Featured animals may include a rat or mouse family, snake and a toad. (Animals are handled.)

Biomes: 7th grade (50 minutes). The volunteer brings a variety of plants and animals indigenous to several of the biomes studied: tundra, desert, grassland/savannah, deciduous forest, rainforest. Featured animals may include the Uromastyx, snake, hamsters, a millipede and night crawlers. (Animals are shown in their cages.)

Endangered Elephants: 8th grade (50 minutes). The volunteer brings a variety of confiscated elephant items and discusses how changes in ecosystems caused by living organisms, including humans, such as the poaching of elephants for ivory has led to an increase in tusklessness in elephant populations. A power point presentation accompanies the lesson.
