



## Minutes from the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors Monday, October 20, 2025

---

The Board of Directors held a Regular Board Meeting on Monday, October 20, 2025. This meeting was held in-person and virtually via a Zoom link posted on the Mead School District website. The meeting, that began at 6 pm, was held at Union Event Center. Directors Cannon, Gray, Burchard, Nolan and Killman were present. Also attending were Superintendent Travis Hanson, Chief Financial Officer Heather Ellingson and Assistant Superintendents Jay Jordan and Jared Hoadley.

### I. Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting began with President Cannon asking all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

### II. Approval of Agenda

Director Killman made a motion to approve the meeting agenda, as presented. Director Nolan seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### III. Approval of Minutes

Director Nolan made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting and October 6, 2025 Work Session, as presented. Director Killman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### IV. Remarks for the Good of the Schools - Public Comment on Agenda Items

President Cannon first opened the floor for school updates. This was followed by board/staff comments. There were no individuals who signed up to speak on agenda items.

#### *High School Reports*

**Mt. Spokane High School** - Beau Tampien, ASB President, presented a brief review of the academic, athletic, leadership and music events recently completed and upcoming at Mt. Spokane High School. All Fall Sport athletic teams are doing very well including in rivalry competitions against Mead High School. Football is 5-1, Softball is undefeated, Soccer is 5-0-2, Volleyball is 6-1 and Cross Country has won every Dual Meet so far this year. ASB students are working on the Veterans Day Assembly, an upcoming Blood Drive and will be hosting a *Trunk or Treat* event at the October 30<sup>th</sup> football game.

**Mead High School** - Ben Herzog, ASB President, presented a brief review of the academic, athletic, leadership and music events recently completed and upcoming at Mead High School. A joint Mead HS/Mt. Spokane HS Food Drive has, so far, resulted in the collection/donation of over 2,000 lbs. of food to the Mead Food Bank. At the recent *Pacific NW Marching Band Competition* that took place at Union Stadium, Mead HS placed 3<sup>rd</sup> followed very closely by Mt. Spokane who was 4<sup>th</sup>. At the upcoming Mead HS vs Gonzaga Prep football game both schools will participate in a *No White Flags* fundraiser with proceeds going to Team Gleason, a non-profit organization started by Steve Gleason to support individuals with ALS. Fall Sport athletic teams are doing very well. Mead HS ASB students are also working on Veterans Day plans that, in addition to an assembly, include a fundraiser benefiting homeless veterans. Mead HS will also be hosting a *Trunk or Treat* event.

## *Board/Staff Comments*

Regarding the *Pacific NW Marching Band Competition*, President Cannon was very complimentary of the shows performed by both Mead and Mt. Spokane, noting their scores were separated by only one point.

Director Nolan, in complimenting the Cheer Programs at both Mead and Mt. Spokane, called attention to the recent opportunity elementary students, including his daughter, had to cheer with high school cheerleaders at a football game.

### **V. Continuing Business**

#### **A. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading Policy & Procedure 2020 Revision**

##### **Course Design, Selection and Adoption of Instructional Materials**

President Cannon, referencing a recent email from Director Nolan regarding the need for additional changes to this policy/procedure revision, and noting this is an action item, suggested the board either table/defer action or vote on the policy/procedure revision as presented.

Following discussion, that included reference to an OSPI November 1<sup>st</sup> revision adoption deadline, and Director Nolan noting the importance of making sure the board takes its time and approves/passes good policy, Director Nolan made a motion to table/defer action so that further discussion can take place at the upcoming, November 3, 2025 Work Session. Director Killman seconded the motion. The motion carried. Director Burchard abstained as he was not present for the policy/procedure revision discussion that took place at the October 6, 2025 Work Session.

#### **B. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading Policy & Procedure 4010 Revision**

##### **Learning Improvement**

Learning & Teaching Assistant Superintendent Jay Jordan presented for second reading consideration a revision to Policy & Procedure 4010, Learning Improvement. The policy and procedure were adopted on January 27, 2003, with no revisions since that date.

In each draft document new proposed language was red and language to be deleted was crossed out/highlighted.

The revisions to the policy and procedure were discussion topics at the September 8, 2025 Work Session, September 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting (first reading) and October 6, 2025 Work Session. Feedback from those discussions was incorporated into the presented draft documents.

The primary change to both the policy and procedure is replacing the term *Council for Learning Improvement* with *Building Leadership Team*. This change updates the policy/procedure to comply with current district practice.

Director Burchard made a motion to approve the second reading revisions to Policy and Procedure 4010, Learning Improvement, as presented. Director Nolan seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **C. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading Policy & Procedure 3241 Revision**

##### **Student Discipline**

Superintendent Travis Hanson presented a revision to Policy & Procedure 3241, Student Discipline, for second reading consideration. This policy/procedure was adopted on September 10, 2018, with one revision taking place on June 27, 2022.

WSSDA Sample Policy 3241 and WSSDA Sample Procedure 3241 were used as the base/templates for the presented revisions. In each document new proposed language was red and WSSDA language to be deleted was crossed out/highlighted. Board members were also provided with a copy of a *Behavior Violation Matrix and Best Practices* document that is referenced in the

proposed procedure revision. The presented revisions comply with state law and current district practice.

The revisions were discussion topics at the September 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting (first reading) and October 6, 2025 Work Session.

To help educate school administrators on student discipline law changes attorney Garrett Williams has completed one training with a second training scheduled for later in the month of October.

Director Killman asked if the revisions to this policy and procedure were brought forward because of recent changes to the teacher's contract. Superintendent Hanson shared there is no direct correlation between the new teacher contract and the presented revisions. New emergency rules regarding classroom exclusions were put into place in 2024 pending Public Comment on those rules. In July 2025 those rules were officially adopted hence the need to update the policy and procedure to reflect the officially approved rules.

Director Burchard made a motion to approve the second reading revisions to Policy and Procedure 3241, Student Discipline, as presented. Director Nolan seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **D. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading Policy 2331 Adoption Controversial Issues - Guest Speakers**

Learning & Teaching Assistant Superintendent Jay Jordan presented the adoption of Policy 2331, Controversial Issues - Guest Speakers, for second reading consideration. This would be a new policy for the Mead School District.

WSSDA Sample Policy 2331 was used as the template for the presented policy adoption. Items deleted from the WSSDA version was highlighted/crossed out and new proposed language was red.

The adoption of this policy was a discussion topic at the September 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting (first reading) and October 6, 2025 Work Session. Feedback from those discussions was incorporated into the presented 2<sup>nd</sup> reading policy draft.

Director Nolan, regarding the board's policy and procedure adoption/revision process, shared he likes the current practice of providing for board discussion/input at both Regular Board Meetings and Work Sessions.

Director Killman made a motion to adopt Policy 2331, Controversial Issues - Guest Speakers, as presented. Director Burchard seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading Policy 5281 Revision & Procedure 5281 Suspension Disciplinary Action & Discharge**

Human Resources Director Keri Hutchins presented a revision to Policy 5281, Disciplinary Action & Discharge, and the suspension of Procedure 5281, for second reading consideration. Both the policy and procedure were adopted on October 8, 2012. There have been no revisions since that date.

The presented policy revision is identical to WSSDA Sample Policy 5281. Legal counsel recommends the district adopt the WSSDA version of this policy and, at the same time, suspend the current procedure (WSSDA no longer recommends having the procedure). The presented policy revision complies with state law and current district practice.

The revision to Policy 5281 and suspension of Procedure 5281 were discussion topics at the September 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting (first reading) and October 6, 2025 Work Session.

Director Nolan made a motion to approve the second reading revisions to Policy 5281, Disciplinary Action & Discharge, and the suspension of Procedure 5281, as presented. Director Burchard seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

**VI. New Business**  
**A. Consent Agenda**

President Cannon read aloud the donations listed in the Consent Agenda and thanked those individuals and organizations for their generosity and support of Mead School District students.

Director Nolan made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, as presented. Director Gray seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### B. Student Travel Proposal Mead High School Girls Basketball

Learning & Teaching Assistant Superintendent Jay Jordan presented a request from Mead High School Girls Basketball, 12 athletes plus three adult chaperones including Head Coach Quantae Anderson, to travel to San Diego, California, December 26-31, 2025, to compete in the *Surf 'N Slam* basketball tournament.

The trip takes place during Winter Break so no school will be missed.

The estimated per student cost is \$275-\$400 with fundraising opportunities available. ASB funds will cover tournament fees.

Following discussion, that included Director Nolan referencing the need for the board to look at the district's Student Travel policy/procedure, specifically with regard to assuring chaperone consistency, Director Nolan made a motion to approve the request from Mead High School Girls Basketball to travel to San Diego, California, December 26-31, 2025, as presented. Director Gray seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### C. Student Travel Proposal Mt. Spokane Yearbook

Learning & Teaching Assistant Superintendent Jay Jordan presented a request from Mt. Spokane Yearbook, 8 students plus 1-2 adult chaperones including Yearbook Advisor Susan Best, to travel to Nashville, Tennessee, November 13-16, 2025, to take part in the JEA Convention. At this convention students will attend sessions, led by industry professionals, on various aspects of journalism and yearbook production.

Students will miss two days of school, November 13 and November 14, and Ms. Best will need a substitute teacher for those same two days.

The estimated per student cost is \$500 with fundraising opportunities available. ASB funds will cover the remaining trip expenses.

Director Burchard made a motion to approve the request from Mt. Spokane Yearbook to travel to Nashville, Tennessee, November 13-16, 2025, as presented. Director Gray seconded the motion. The motion carried. Director Nolan abstained as he has a child who is a Mt. Spokane Yearbook student and will be a JEA Convention participant.

#### **D. Student Travel Proposal Mead High School DECA**

Learning & Teaching Assistant Superintendent Jay Jordan presented a request from Mead High School DECA, 10 students plus two adult chaperones including DECA Advisor Brandon Butler, to travel to Arlington, Virginia, November 20-23, 2025, to take part in the DECA Power Trip Leadership Conference. This conference is designed to help prepare students for DECA competitions and instruct current DECA officers in how to train next year's officers.

Students will miss two days of school, November 20 and November 21, and Mr. Butler will need a substitute teacher for those same two days.

The estimated per student cost is \$300 with fundraising opportunities available. ASB and CTE funds will cover the remaining trip expenses.

In response to a question from Director Nolan it was confirmed the female chaperone for the trip is the wife of Brandon Butler. Director Nolan expressed personal reservations about this husband/wife chaperone arrangement. Regarding CTE funding, Dr. Jordan confirmed CTE monies are provided by the state.

Director Burchard made a motion to approve the request from Mead High School DECA to travel to Arlington, Virginia, November 20-23, 2025, as presented. Director Killman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **E. 1<sup>st</sup> Reading Policy 1111 Revision Oath of Office**

Superintendent Travis Hanson presented a revision to Policy 1111, Oath of Office, for first reading, non-action, consideration. This policy was adopted on January 29, 2007. There have been no revisions to the policy.

WSSDA Sample Policy 1111 was used as the template for the presented revision. New WSSDA language was highlighted/red and language no longer included in the WSSDA policy was crossed out/highlighted.

During the 2025 Legislative Session the Legislature affirmed and strengthened oath of office requirements for school board directors in House Bill 1296, Sec. 305(2). Before directors can be seated to undertake their duties, they must swear an oath, not only to the U.S. Constitution, but also to the Constitution and laws of the state of Washington. The addition of the phrase, *laws of the state of Washington*, is a new oath requirement.

For the record, President Cannon stated/affirmed no board member has broken any state law in connection with their role as a member of the Mead School District Board of Directors.

This was a first reading, non-action, item.

## VII. Reports

### A. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Hanson shared the following:

1. The district's Technology Committee recently hosted a community event, *Parenting in the Digital Age*, that was attended by approximately 30 individuals. Superintendent Hanson thanked Assistant Superintendent Jared Hoadley and committee members for their work in sponsoring the informative evening.
2. On October 21<sup>st</sup> the district's Safety & Security Committee, led by Assistant Superintendent Jared Hoadley, will host a community meeting at Northwood Middle School.
3. The week of October 20<sup>th</sup> is *School Bus Safety Week*. Superintendent Hanson expressed appreciation to the entire Transportation Department led by Tony Davis (Director) and Scott Cole (Assistant Director) for providing great customer service to Mead School District students and parents as they safely transport students to and from school, athletic competitions and other school related activities.
4. Congratulations were extended to Brentwood 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher Jolene Sundheim who was named *EWU Teacher of the Month* for October. Ms. Sundheim is one of many excellent educators teaching in the Mead School District.
5. State Senator Leonard Christian will be visiting Mt. Spokane High School on Wednesday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>. In addition to touring the school facility the visit will include the opportunity to observe some of the specific programs offered at Mt. Spokane.
6. NAC has completed the facilities *Study and Survey* that is required every six years. Facilities & Planning Director Ned Wendle will share results and seek board approval of this report at an upcoming board meeting. The report information will be used to update the district's 25-Year Facilities Plan and, additionally, help inform the work of a future Facilities Planning Committee.
7. The work of the district's Balanced Calendar Committee, led by Heather Havens, will be a discussion topic at the upcoming, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, Work Session. Ms. Havens is currently talking with MEA about Elementary Conferences and the possibility of moving February conferences to March.

### VIII. Remarks for the Good of the Schools - Public Comment on Non-Agenda Items

**Erica Sneddon**, Mead School District parent of five children who are MLO (North Star) students, addressed the board regarding frustrations around curriculum, noting in particular long delays in receiving curriculum and the lack of adequate administrative support staff at MLO to handle ordering curriculum for nearly 1000 students.
