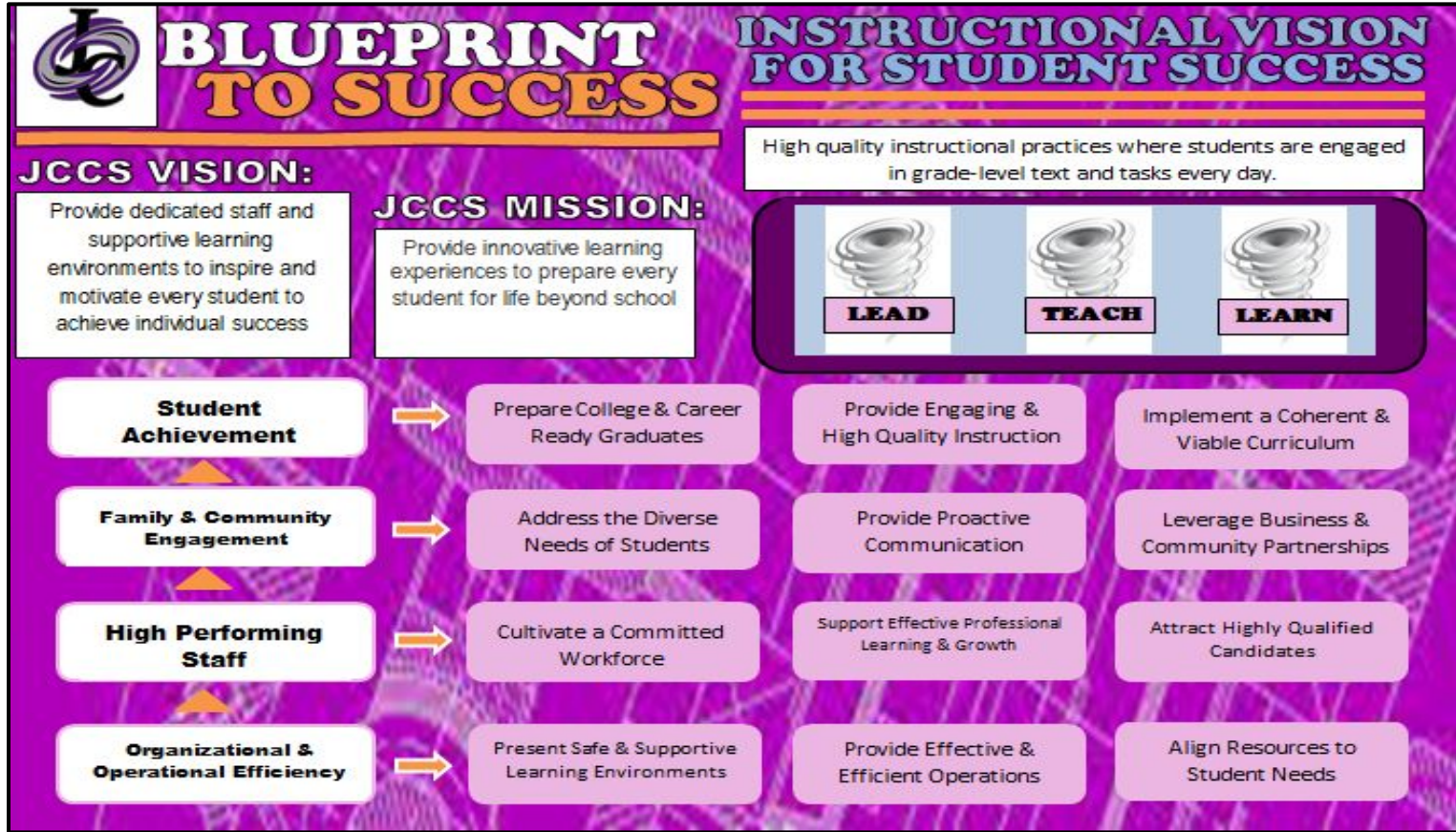

# What is Title I?

Title I is a part of ESSA, the Every Student Succeeds Act, formerly known as the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (1965). The new act provides financial assistance to state and local education agencies to meet the educational needs of children who may be at risk of failing the state's performance standards.

Title I funds provide all children the opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.



## **What are the requirements of Title I?**

- **Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA)** - A comprehensive needs assessment helps identify how services will be delivered. Teachers are involved in analysis of academic assessments.
- **School Improvement Plan (SIP)**- A formal and comprehensive plan must be developed for each school on a schoolwide plan, outlining how both school and Title I resources will be used to meet the identified needs.
- **Parent Engagement** - Parents are involved in plan development, revision, and review.
- **Instructional Programs** - Title I funds are used to provide professional development for all staff to support all students. Program promotes improved instruction for all students and constitutes comprehensive school reform.

**Title I funds are allocated for additional academic support through support staff, programs, technology, and other resources.**

**1% of Title I federal funds are allocated for parent engagement.**

- Instructional and academic resources for a Parent Resource Center/Section
- Instructional Resources for student support
- Parent and Family Engagement workshops and activities
- Other needs such as childcare or light refreshments for Parent Workshops and activities

## **What are the types of service models offered through Title I?**

There are two types of service models: Schoolwide and Targeted Assistance.

Jasper County Charter Schools use a SCHOOL-WIDE service model. All of our students are eligible for services through Title I.



## **Goals for the Jasper County Charter System are:**

- By the end of the school year 2025-2026, all teachers will have continued job-embedded Professional Learning to analyze data to determine and implement high leverage, evidence based instructional practices to ensure students achieve mastery of the standards.
- By the end of the school year 2025-2026, JCCS will decrease the total number of students with 10 or more absences during the FY26 school year by 1% (as measured by the FY26 ENR data report).

## **Goals for JCMS are:**

- By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, JCMS will increase the percentage of students achieving proficiency based on their reading readiness level by 3% as measured by the District-approved assessment.
- By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, JCMS will increase the percentage of students achieving math proficiency by 3% as measured by the District-approved assessment.
- During the 2025-2026 school year, teachers will engage in the weekly professional community process to improve teacher practice as measured by 80% of teachers demonstrating proficiency on the JCCS targeted walkthrough form.
- JCMS will decrease the number of students discipline referrals by 5%.

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) is designed to provide information about how well students are mastering the state-adopted content standards in the core content areas of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

The GMAS will consist of both End of Grade (EOG) for grades 3-8 and End of Course (EOC) tests in American Literature & Composition, Algebra 1/Coordinate Algebra, Biology, US History.

In compliance with the requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) the Jasper County School System informs parents that you may request information about the professional qualifications of your student's teacher(s).

The following information may be requested:

Whether the student's teacher-

- has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived; and
- is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.

Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

If you wish to request information concerning your child's teacher and/or paraprofessional's qualifications, please contact the principal of the school.
