**1. Describe the Grant- Be creative, specific, and explain how implementation relates to student success**

**2. What are your goals?**

Limit the number to 3. Be specific and share outcomes you hope to achieve.

**3. Explain Evaluation Criteria**

Related to stated goals. Indicate how you know this project will be successful.

**4. State Curriculum Methods/ Activities**

Include a timeline. How will the students learn?

**Grant Applications will not save during the process**



## Willis ISD Education Foundation **Grant Guidelines 2025**

Grants 4 Student Success is designed to encourage, facilitate, and reward creative instructional approaches to your student's educational experience.

### **Eligibility:**

Any individual employed by Willis ISD who is involved in the instruction of students or related support services.

You are only allowed to apply for **ONE** grant per year.

Grants due November 4<sup>th</sup> by 5pm

Grants reviewed November 12th

Grants awarded via surprise prize patrol – It is a SURPRISE!!!

### **Policies:**

A **detailed** itemization of all costs and materials is expected.

Estimates are not acceptable. **All technology purchases must be purchased from an approved WISD vendor**

No funds will be awarded for consumables, salaries, teacher trips, stickers, food.

\*\*\* In the event that a grant recipient transfers to another school within the district, the Teacher may transfer the grant award to the transfer school upon consideration and approval by the grant committee. If the transferring teacher is one member of a group that applied (example, 4th grade team applied and received said grant), the grant will remain at the school that was awarded the grant.
