Special Area Classes

All students participate in two special area classes a day including:

- Visual Arts: exposure to art history, opportunity to work in all types of mediums including textiles, ceramics, and set design
- Music: playing instruments such as ukuleles, xylophones, drums, opportunity to move to music, create music, and exposure to a variety of composers and genres
- Drama: basic acting techniques, theater history, performances, puppetry, improvisation, and script writing
- Cultural Arts: introduction to second language, study of Hispanic culture and history
- Physical Education: creative movement through fundamental movement, rhythmic movement, gymnastics, an introduction to a variety of sports
- Suzuki Violin/Orchestra: basic Suzuki instruction with required guardian involvement in K-3; string instruction with note reading in grades 4 & 5
- Ballet: dance instruction in traditional ballet
- STEAM: project based tasks using science, technology, engineering, art, and math to engage students in collaborative real-world problem solving
- Media Arts: lessons focused on ELA skills especially reading, writing, speaking, and listening, participating in research, and exposure to a variety of genres, texts, and authors


