October Enrollment Summaries are based on enrollment on the first weekday in October as reported in the student information system (SIS).

Students receiving Special Education services only who are not regularly attending, but are in the student information system (SIS), are excluded from the enrollment summaries.

Program type (i.e., elementary, middle, high, etc.) reflects the grade-span of the Schools in that particular year. Schools changing grade-spans and Program Types artificially inflate the Change calculations. See School Detail and Footnotes for more information about the specific Schools that changed. In recent years enrollment counts are compiled on or about the first school day of October. An enrolled student is defined as a student who attends one or more schools or programs within the District. Regardless of the number of schools or programs attended, each student is counted only once; the counts are unduplicated. (4) Effective 2023-24, SEGC impact: Arleta lost neighborhood students to Creston, Marysville, Woodstock, and Woodmere. Gained neighborhood students from Bridger and Marysville.

(5) Effective 2023-24, SEGC impact: Atkinson gained neighborhood students from Bridger.

(6) Effective 2023-24, SEGC impact: Bridger merged with Creative Science and lost neighborhood enrollment to Atkinson and Arleta. Bridger Spanish Immersion moved to Lent.

(7) Effective 2023-24, Clark re-opened with students in K-5 moving from Harrison Park, including Mandarin Immersion.

(8) Effective 2023-24, SEGC impact: Glencoe losing neighborhood students to Vestal.

- (37) Effective 2019-20, Madison moved to the Marshall location for construction and is expected to return to the original site after construction is completed.
- (38) Effective 2019-20, Trillium closed.
- (39) Effective 2018-19, Boise-Eliot/Humboldt, MLK Jr, Irvington, and Sabin became K-5's, with the 6-8 grades from each school going to Harriet Tubman, a new middle school opened in 2018-19.
