Scholarship History: The Mary Elizabeth Sievert Scholarship was established by her estate when she passed away in 2017. Ms. Sievert retired from Central High school where she taught Chemistry and the gifted and talented students. She was later one of the first female administrators in the district.

Eligibility: The recipient will be a Central High senior who is outstanding in both science (specifically Chemistry) and leadership/service in the Davenport Community School District.

Requirements: Selection is based on academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, moral character, and community involvement. Applicants must also complete a 300-word essay outlining their purpose in going to college, their immediate objectives, and their future goals.

Award: This endowed scholarship will award up to \$2,200 to the recipient, subject to investment returns, one per year. Funds will be paid directly to the college or university.

Selection Committee: Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by members of the Davenport Schools Foundation Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
