Scholarship History: The Jack L. Hudson Scholarship was established by Dr. John Thiel, Class of 1965, in recognition of the positive impact West High School science teacher Jack Hudson had on him, his friends, and many other students. Hudson retired from West High and died in 2015.

Eligibility: Selection of recipients is based on financial need, academic achievement (either a 24 ACT or 3.25 G.P.A.) and other conditions considered appropriate by the Selection Committee. All selections will be made on an objective and non-discriminatory basis.

Award: This scholarship fund is endowed. One scholarship in the amount of up to \$1,400 will be awarded each year. The amount of the award may vary according to available funding. Funds will be paid directly to the college or university.

Selection Committee: The recipient is selected by the Science teachers at West High from seniors who have shown an interest in science and who intend to enroll in an accredited four-year college or university. Selection is based on academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, moral character, and community involvement. Applicants must also complete a 300-word essay outlining their purpose in going to college, their immediate objectives and their future goals.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
