Scholarship History: The Friends of West Scholarship was inspired by generous start-up gifts received by Dr. Tony and Mary Williams and Robin Tuzcak. The trio spearheaded the campaign to bring a new scholarship to West High graduating seniors in order to help them continue their education at a two or four-year college or technical school. Funding was secured from West alumni, students, businesses, teachers and friends. In honor of their 50th Class Reunion, the Class of '66 joined in the effort and raised the final funds to make the scholarship a reality beginning Spring 2017.

Eligibility: This one-time up to \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from West High School who demonstrates scholastic achievement, extracurricular involvement and community service. Recipients must be enrolled in an accredited two or four-year college or university in the U.S.

Requirements: Selection of recipients is based on financial need, academic achievement (either a 24 ACT or 3.25 G.P.A.) and other conditions considered appropriate by the Selection Committee. All selections will be made on an objective and non-discriminatory basis.

Award: This scholarship is endowed and is for \$1,500. Awards are for one year only and will be applied toward tuition, books and fees. Awards will be paid directly to the institution in August upon receipt of verification of enrollment.

Selection Committee: Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by members of the Davenport Schools Foundation Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
