Benefits




- Taking AP classes and exams can help students:
 - Build Skills and Confidence
 - AP students learn essential time management and study skills needed for college and career success.
 - They dig deeper into subjects that interest them and learn to tap their creativity and their problem-solving skills to address course challenges.
- Get into College
 - Students who take AP courses send a signal to colleges that they're serious about their education and that they're willing to challenge themselves with rigorous coursework.
 - 85% of selective colleges and universities report that a student's AP experience favorably impacts admission decisions.
- Succeed in College
 - Research shows that students who receive a score of 2 on their AP Exams are ready for college work.
 - Research shows that students who receive a score of 3 or higher on AP Exams typically experience greater academic success in college and have higher graduation rates than their non-AP peers.
 - 3 out of 4 AP students enrolled in a four-year college start school with some AP credit.
- Save Time and Money in College
 - Research shows that students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely than their peers to complete a college degree on time—which means they avoid paying for, for example, a fifth year of tuition.
 - Most colleges and universities nationwide offer college credit, advanced placement, or both for qualifying AP Exam scores. This can mean:
 - Fulfilling graduation requirements early
 - Being able to skip introductory courses or required general-education courses

Rules and Expectations for




- Students can only Opt Out until the end of the **1st Nine Weeks (October 10th)** and at the end of the Fall Semester (**AP Exam Fees Apply/NO REFUNDS**). Schedules will not be changed at any other time.
- Students are Expected and Required to:
 - Join AP Classroom for each AP Class (Join Codes given by AP Teacher)
 - Students should use a PERSONAL EMAIL address they can easily access for their College Board account.
 - **They need to remember their username and password for their College Board account.***
 - Students need to use their LEGAL First and Last Name for College Board.
 - Take the AP Exam in May (Required for 5.0 GPA CLASS OF 2027 & 2028) ?
 - Take a Mock Exam in August and February (NMSI Courses ONLY)
 - Take Progress Checks throughout the year





Grading Policy



UIL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Students must earn a 60+ in AP/Honors/DC courses each grading period to remain eligible for ALL UIL activities.




Make-Up Policy:

Students have the # of days absent + 1 day to make up work (i.e. Student misses 3 days. They have 4 days to make up missing work.)



Late Work Policy:






AP Contracts




NMSI STEM Star Award



- ECISD Partnership with NMSI provides support for the AP Program for teachers and students in Math, Science, and English courses.
- NMSI STEM Star Scholarship
 - Criteria for Nomination:
 - Demonstrate growth in AP coursework over the course of the year
 - Demonstrate leadership, self-advocacy, and/or commitment in the classroom
 - Actively engage in course both in and outside of the classroom
 - Student must have at least a B average in the AP course
- Teachers nominate in February
- Selected students will receive a \$500 check and a celebratory NMSI STEM Star Award in the Spring





GPA/Credit



- **GPA Weight for Core and LOTE AP Courses: 5.0**
- **GPA Weight for ALL AP Courses: 5.0 (Class of 2027 & 2028)**

- AP Distinction (4 years in the same Honors/AP Course): Blue/Green Cord
- AP Scholar/Scholar with Honor/Scholar with Distinction): Red/Black Cord

Students who receive a 3, 4, or 5 on AP Exams will earn the CCMR point needed for Graduation!

Award	Criteria
AP Scholar	Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.
AP Scholar with Honor	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.
AP Scholar with Distinction	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.





Exam Payment Information

- AP Exams cost \$20 each; Free/Reduced= \$0 for exams.
 - (College Board charges \$99 per exam!)
- **Payment DUE October 27th for FULL YEAR Courses and February 16th for 2nd Semester Courses (Gov't/Eco)**
- No Refunds per AP Contract!
- Exams can be paid for:
 - Through the Bookkeeper (C- Hall), Mrs. Hernandez
 - Online with a credit card at paypams.com





Exam Additional Fees

- **Late Fees:** \$40 additional late fee will be added to the original exam fee for each exam AFTER October 27th. (Exam Total Cost with Late Fee =\$60 each)
- **Cancellation Fees:** Students who Opt Out past the the first Nine Weeks (Oct.10th) and have an exam ordered will incur an additional fee per canceled exam. (Exam Total Cost with Cancellation Fee= \$40)
- **Unused Exam Fees:** Students who order an AP Exam and do not show in May will be charged a \$40 Unused Exam Fee in addition to the original Exam fee. (Exam total Cost for Unused Exams= \$60 each)
- **Late Exam Fee:** \$40 additional fee charged to order late exams with unapproved College Board absence (MUST PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION FOR LATE EXAM ORDER APPROVAL and NO FEE i.e. doctor's note).
 - Late Exams will be May 19-23, 2025=Finals Week/After School Ends






Important Dates

- Last day to Opt Out of AP: **October 10, 2025 - end of 1st 9 Weeks**
 - Parents and Students must email/contact their Alpha Counselor for the Opt Out Paperwork
- AP Exam Payments for Spring Semester Courses ONLY due by: **Feb. 16, 2026**
- College Night: **September 10 @ OC**
- PSAT/SAT School Day: **October 8, 2025**
- AP EXAMS: **May 4-15 (AP Exams will be either ALL Digital, Hybrid, or Paper)**




