**Scholarship History:** This scholarship was created in 2014 by the golden anniversary class of Central High School. Their goal is to assist a current graduate with college fees while also honoring the beloved teachers who helped them advance their own education and careers 50 years ago. Funding for this scholarship is anticipated to be \$2,500 each year, subject to investment returns.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must graduate from Davenport Central High School by the last day of June. Recipients must be enrolled in an accredited two or four-year college or university in the U.S. and plan to major in education. An Expected Family Contribution (EFC) score determined by the FAFSA form must be provided.

**Requirements:** Student must have a 3.25 GPA or a 24 ACT. A letter of recommendation is required.

**Award:** One (1) scholarship of up to \$2,500 and is a one-time award.

**Selection Committee:** Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by members of the Davenport Schools Foundation Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
