MILLSAP COMMUNITY

Millsap, Texas, is a small rural community located in Parker County in north-central Texas, approximately 15 miles west of Weatherford. With a population of around 370 according to the 2020 Census—and some estimates projecting closer to 440 in 2025—Millsap remains a quiet, close-knit town with a motto that reflects its character: “Little town. Big heart.” The town covers just under 1.5 square miles and sits at an elevation of 817 feet, surrounded by open farmland and rolling countryside.

The town’s history is rooted in transportation and agriculture. Originally founded as a relay station on a stagecoach line in the late 1800s, While the population peaked around 800 in the early 20th century, it declined through the mid-1900s and has remained relatively small since. Still, the community maintains a strong identity and civic life, with regular events, an active city hall, and a visible investment in education and community well-being.

Millsap is served by the Millsap Independent School District, which includes Millsap High School, a well-rated 3A campus that offers a range of academic and career pathways. While the town itself offers limited commercial infrastructure, its proximity to Weatherford and Mineral Wells allows residents to access broader services, healthcare, and employment opportunities. The town appeals especially to those seeking a rural lifestyle with access to urban amenities nearby. Despite its small size, Millsap exhibits community pride, civic engagement, and a strong commitment to maintaining its identity while supporting gradual growth.

MILLSAP HIGH SCHOOL

Millsap High School is a small public high school located in Millsap, Texas, serving students in grades 9 through 12 as part of the Millsap Independent School District (MISD). With an enrollment of around 300 students, the school maintains a low student-to-teacher ratio of approximately 10:1, allowing for more individualized attention and support. Millsap High School is classified as a UIL Class 3A school and offers a strong academic program with a variety of pathways to college, career, and military readiness. The school boasts a 100% graduation rate and reports that all students graduate meeting College, Career, or Military Readiness (CCMR) standards, a statistic that places Millsap High well above state averages. The academic program includes honors courses, as well as a robust dual credit program in partnership with Weatherford College—63% of students participate in dual credit coursework, with some graduating with an associate degree. Career and Technical Education (CTE) opportunities are also available in various fields and programs of study offerings on campus. In terms of academic achievement, the campus earned an “A” accountability rating from the Texas Education Agency, reflecting strong performance in student achievement, school progress, and closing performance gaps.

Beyond academics, Millsap High School offers a wide range of extracurricular activities and student organizations. These include FFA, Beta Club, Student Council, FCCLA, UIL Academics, Spanish Club, Cheer Maroon Crew, art and theater programs, band, and yearbook. The school also supports a full athletics program, including football, basketball, baseball, softball, track, tennis, cross country, volleyball, golf, and powerlifting. The school promotes strong community values and a positive school culture, reflected in its mission to empower students with knowledge, character, and a passion for lifelong learning. With dedicated staff, active parent and community involvement, and a focus on student success, Millsap High School provides a well-rounded educational experience in a supportive, rural setting.
