School Board Brief
October 16, 2025

At the October 16, 2025 School Board Meeting, the Central Bucks Board of School Directors:

Heard Superintendent’s Report: Substitute Superintendent Dr. Malone recognized and congratulated Warwick Elementary School student Hadley S. for her winning lock screen artwork based on the theme “[See the Good, Be the Good](#)”. Hadley was presented with a certificate and a gift card to Olive Garden restaurant. Dr. Malone recognized and congratulated students named to Semifinalist status in the National Merit Scholarship. Semifinalists include Susanna Dai, Hanwen Hu, Madelyn Madrid, and Harper Polan from CB East; Alaina Ahuja, David Dougherty, Deborah Gym, Julian Grofcsik, and Lucas Mohr from CB South; and Noah Gerstein and Sanat Nayak from CB West.

Dr. Malone recognized and congratulated our K–12 Art Department for being named an [Outstanding Visual Arts Community](#) by the Pennsylvania Art Education Association for the 2024-2025 school year. We are fortunate to have 36 dedicated educators across the district teaching and promoting visual arts, and each was instrumental in achieving this accomplishment.

Dr. Malone recognized and thanked the Bucks County Drug & Alcohol Commission's Executive Director Diane Rosati for awarding the district a \$95,000 grant to support the expansion of the Second Step program in grades K–8. Second Step is an evidence-based social-emotional learning curriculum that helps students build skills in empathy, emotion management, problem-solving, and responsible decision-making. Dr. Malone also thanked K-12 Health and Physical Education Coordinator and Realignment Coordinator Angela Hendershot for working with BCDAC to obtain the grant. The grant includes \$50,000.00 to fund a three-year license for up to 20 school sites, and up to \$45,000.00 for the Devereux Center for Effective Schools to assist with professional development, coaching, and evaluation to ensure the program’s successful implementation.

Dr. Malone reviewed items that will be voted upon at this evening's meeting, including some finance, operations, policy, and human resources items. Dr. Malone welcomed new staff members who appear on the agenda.
