CHANGE IS BREWING!

Throughout New York State school districts continue to face unprecedented challenges from increased costs, under funding, unfunded mandates, new standards, revisions of graduation requirements, declining enrollment, the rise of Al, a changing economy, the impact of social media, and student mental health.

The New York State Education Department (NYSED) launched a statewide Regionalization initiative in July of 2024 as a response to these ever-changing challenges. The component districts in Cattaraugus-Allegany BOCES, including West Valley, have worked together since July 2024 to develop a Regionalization Plan for our region.

You will see in this newsletter that our Board of Education goals for the 2025-2026 school year focus on regionalization activities. What is regionalization, what does it mean for West Valley, what does it mean for the region, and what is the benefit for students?

#### WHAT IS REGIONALIZATION?

The Regionalization Initiative is a collaborative regional planning approach for local districts to communicate what they need to ensure equitable educational opportunities for all students, leveraging the state's existing capabilities, talent, and infrastructure. By engaging in regional conversations, schools and districts may identify, explore, and choose whether to pursue a variety of possible solutions to the academic and operational challenges they face by tapping into the full span of resources that already exist in their larger region, (NYSED, 2024).

#### **REGIONALIZATION PLANNING TIMELINE**

Regionalization planning began in July of 2024 with NYSED representatives presenting to Superintendents and Boards of Education through September 2024. Individual school districts completed the next step through October of 2024 by completing a strength and needs assessment. From November 2024 to June 2025, Superintendents formed regional groups and determined regional priorities and activities. All members of the school community were invited to attend Zoom meetings that were held in June and July 2025. Finally, individual school

districts determined specific activities in September of 2025, and the CA BOCES Regionalization Plan was submitted to the state on October 1, 2025.

#### WHAT DOES REGIONALIZATION MEAN FOR WEST VALLEY AND THE REGION?

Rural schools across the state face many of the same challenges. All schools in the CA BOCES region, regardless of size, face challenges that cannot be solved by the district itself. NYSED recognizes the desire of most school districts to remain independent and sustainable. Therefore, regionalization is a flexible plan that encourages districts to work collaboratively with each other and to share resources to provide all students in the region with the same great opportunities regardless of size or location. In West Valley, we aim to enact our Regionalization activities to provide more opportunities for our students, to have a well-rounded education, and reach their full potential.

#### WHAT TYPE OF REGIONALIZATION ACTIVITIES WILL WEST VALLEY PARTICIPATE IN?

West Valley is in a regional group that includes Ellicottville, Franklinville, and Pioneer. These groups are defined by geography, but each district has the flexibility to work with districts from other regional groupings. West Valley's regional activities will include but not be limited to aligning school bell schedules, expanding options for advanced course work, developing regional mental health supports, and promoting initiatives focused on economic development to retain families in our communities and increase enrollment.

#### WHERE ARE WE NOW AND WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

The implementation of the CA BOCES Regionalization Plan that West Valley is participating in will begin this school year. This will not be a short-term effort across districts but rather a long-term sustained effort over the next 10 years. While athletics is often seen as a way for districts to share and collaborate, our CA BOCES Regionalization Plan looks beyond athletics to student programs, transportation, and everything in between. West Valley is currently engaged in conversations with districts in our region on how we can share resources and collaborate to provide the best for our students.

- Schedule a mid-year and end-of-year agenda item to discuss progress on regionalization activities.

## ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM FOR GRADES 10-12 WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2025

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any interested students in grades 10-12 on Wednesday, December 10, 2025, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 14. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

#### THE ASVAB CEP WILL HELP YOUR STUDENTS:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to any military branch. 

## WISHERTHORNER Living VVell with Diabetes - Together

November is National Diabetes Awareness Month, a time to focus on how families can support loved ones living with diabetes. Whether it's Type 1 or Type 2, diabetes management isn't just an individual effort – it's a family one. Daily routines, meal choices, and even emotions are shared experiences that shape how well someone can manage their condition. Managing diabetes takes daily teamwork, understanding, and encouragement.

Diabetes is a long-term condition that changes how the body handles sugar. It happens when insulin – the hormone that helps move sugar from the blood into cells – doesn't work the way it should or isn't made in enough amounts. Managing it means paying close attention to meals, activity, stress, and medication every day.

#### **KEY POINTS TO COVER:**

- COMMUNICATION MATTERS: Encourage open conversations about how everyone can help – without judgment or pressure.
- MEAL PLANNING AS A TEAM: Choose balanced meals that support stable blood sugar for everyone. It's healthier for the whole household, not just the person with diabetes.

- STAY ACTIVE TOGETHER: Family walks, bike rides, or dance breaks help manage glucose levels and relieve stress.
- LEARN THE SIGNS: Everyone should recognize symptoms
  of low or high blood sugar and know what to do in case of
  emergency.
- EMOTIONAL SUPPORT: Managing diabetes can feel isolating. Check in often, celebrate small wins, and remind your loved one they're not alone.

#### **FINAL THOUGHT:**

When families join in — cooking, learning, and moving — they turn diabetes management into shared care. It's not about perfection, but consistency and compassion. Every small effort — a supportive word, a mindful meal, a shared walk —helps reduce stress and keeps everyone on the same page. Living well with diabetes becomes less about restriction and more about balance, understanding, and connection. In the end, it's the everyday teamwork that strengthens both health and family bonds.
