Step It Up . . . Sophomores

October

- Get to know your Counselor
- Become familiar with the Career Center
- Explore careers you find interesting
- Participate in extracurricular activities
- Take the PSAT
- Narrow down your list of colleges with a few colleges at your current GPA, a few with requirements above your GPA, at least one with requirements below your GPA
- Start searching for financial aid options

November

- Begin to set up your student resume with an activities and awards file

December

- Receive your October PSAT scores in January

January

- Review your PSAT results with your counselor in order to identify your strengths to determine the areas that you may need to improve on
- Register for AP classes beginning your Junior year. Scoring well on these exams can sometimes earn college credit

February

- Start researching and begin a list of colleges that you are interested in

March

- Research college majors

April

- Make sure your student resume file is updated and current

May

- Find a summer job that will boost your skills in an area you hope to pursue. Volunteer your time in your community throughout the summer.

Get Going . . . Juniors

October

- Attend a few college visits in the career center
- Take the PSAT exam

November

- Explore and attend student campus days at the college(s) you are interested in

January

- Begin to look at schools and find three or four that are a good fit for you
- Talk to coaches at colleges if you are interested in playing college sports

February

- Check for tests that are necessary for getting into college like the SAT and ACT
- Make plans with parents/counselors to visit schools over spring break

March

- Go on college visits during spring break
- Prep for the ACT test you'll take next month

April

- Take the Junior ACT test at GHS
- Meet with your counselor to make sure you're on track to graduate next year

May

- Find a summer job that will boost your skills in an area you hope to pursue. Continue to volunteer your time in your community.

June

- Research scholarships: www.mtcis.intocareers.org; www.fastweb.com; www.scholarships.com etc.

Note to Juniors: Remember to challenge yourself in your classes and take classes that may relate to your future career plans.

The Final Countdown . . . Seniors

September

- Register for the SAT or ACT
- Finalize your student resume
- Prepare college applications
- Request letters of recommendation from teachers/counselors

October

- Complete and submit your FAFSA* (*moved to December 1st)

November

- Make your final decision for private schools

December

- Make your final decision for public schools
- Pick up scholarship information packet from the career center and apply for as many local and community scholarships as possible
- Obtain scholarship-financial aid applications from prospective schools

January

- Work on scholarship applications, and check for upcoming application deadlines for both public and private schools

February

- Continue to apply for as many local and community scholarships as possible
- Call the colleges to which you applied to make sure they

received all of your information

March

- Submit your college application, as many school deadlines are March 1st
- Follow up on community scholarships and their deadlines

June

- Check out work study, make housing and meal plans and contact your roommate
