SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

The Cherokee County School District is a rural/metro district which encompasses more than 423 square miles.; it is one of the top school districts in Georgia. Located about 40 miles north of Atlanta, Creekview High School is one of 6 high schools, 7 middle schools, 23 elementary schools, 5 STEM academies and 2 Fine Arts academies, one alternative school for MS/HS, one online iGrad Virtual Academy and two preschool centers in the 9th largest school system in Georgia. CCSD is one of the fastest growing districts in the state with a current enrollment of 41,212. Creekview High School and CCSD is accredited by Cognia since March 2022 as a School System of Distinction.

Creekview High School is currently a school of AP STEM, AP STEM Achievement, AP Humanities, AP Humanities Achievement, and an AP School of Distinction Honors. It is also ranked in the top 100 high schools in Georgia. Creekview has been named to the US News and World Report's "Best High Schools" list and is home to the 2018 International Rocketry Challenge World Championship Team!

THE GRADING SYSTEM

Cherokee County uses numerical grades for unweighted grade reporting. Should letter grades be needed the equivalent numerical grades are as follows:

A = 90–100

B = 80–89

C = 71–79

D = 70

F = 0–69

Extra points are awarded to advanced courses as follows when computing weighted NGA:

Honors Courses (20): 5 points added to numerical grade

AP Courses (24): 10 points added to numerical grade

All transcripts to Post-Secondary Institutions reflect the grade for each course before points are added.

Class Rank is determined by the weighted cumulative numeric grade average of graduating seniors at the completion of their graduation requirements. These averages are placed in numerical order from highest to lowest to determine class rank. All classes are included when calculating NGA and class rank.

For purpose of computing a GPA, the following criteria is used:

90–100 = 4

80–89 = 3

71–79 = 2

70 = 1

SCHOOL YEAR

CVHS is on a traditional 7 period schedule. The school year is divided into two semesters (August–December and January–May). Students take 6 classes per semester and can earn .5 credit per class totaling 3 credits per semester; 6 credits per year.

The school day is divided into seven 55 min. periods which meet five days per week. Hours are 8:30 to 3:30. The school year began on August 1, 2025 and ends on May 22, 2026. Second semester will begin on January 6, 2026.
