4. - In February and May - CIP will be reviewed with committee and rate progression with doing a final evaluation of the plan in May.

7. To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, CCE shall: Section 1116 (e)
