1. Narrative description of the Proposition 28 arts education programs funded (2500 character limit).

Prop 28 funds were used to expand access to high-quality, inclusive arts education. Schools enhanced programs in music, visual arts, theater, multimedia, and STEAM. Several elementary schools launched or expanded comprehensive music programs. Visual and performing arts were strengthened with the addition of art and drama instructors. Courses such as claymation and visual arts introduced storytelling and the exploration of cultural art forms. STEAM education grew through labs and project based learning. Middle schools introduced multimedia programs and expanded theater programs. High schools supported offerings in photography, theater, chorus, multimedia, drawing, ceramics, and dance.
