SSB EVENING EXPERIENCE



EVERYTHING DANCE

This class offers a comprehensive dance experience that includes jazz, contemporary, and hip-hop styles, designed to encourage physical activity and promote a body-positive mindset. Through this program, participants not only learn various dance techniques but also develop confidence, coordination, and a strong sense of self-expression. This creative outlet supports their physical health fostering a positive relationship with their body.

FRIENDLY PEERSUASION

Developing participants' skills to resist pressure from those around them, *Friendly PEERsuasion* targets the years during which girls begin to more fully experience and respond to influence and persuasion from their peers to participate in risky behaviors.

MIND + BODY

This class inspires participants to be healthy and strong in both mind and body, focusing on four major areas: physical activity, nutrition, body image, and stress management. Participants will engage in fun, interactive experiences that include arts and crafts (reinforces healthy habits and self-expression), physical activity (exercises and games that promote fitness/well-being), healthy eating (an opportunity to create and learn about nutritious food choices), and practicing techniques to reduce stress.

“GIRLS WHO...” WORKSHOPS

Participants will activate their brains using Girls Inc. Operation SMART curriculum. They'll enjoy participating in STEM-based projects, allowing them to bring home themed creations made with their own hands and ingenuity. Every 4-weeks will come a new theme, finishing the sentence—“Girls Who Build”, “Girls Who Game”, and more!

SSB EVENING EXPERIENCE



ARTISTIC CREATIONS

Participants explore and develop their artistic talents through painting, drawing, and creating a variety of fun projects. This class provides a creative outlet for self-expression allowing girls to hone their skills, explore different mediums, and produce works of art in a supportive and inspiring environment.

MUSICAL THEATER

Girls' Inc. musical theatre class combines singing, acting and musical theatre dance into an hour-long class. Promoting confidence, discipline, and improvisation ability, Musical Theater teaches young performers all about life on the stage!

BE BOLD

Be Bold, a facet of Project Bold, is designed to increase girls' ability to be and feel safe by building their sense of personal power and engaging appropriate resources. Our girl-focused approach speaks to the issues early school-age youth face and lays the foundation for addressing negativity they may experience later on. Through fun, engaging, interactive activities, participants learn about their personal power, being safe in their community, how to be and identify a good friend, basic needs, bodily safety, and everyday people who help keep them safe.

BOLD FUTURES LEADERSHIP

and Community Action



Participants will develop leadership, life skills, and civic duty, while building relationships that demonstrate the value of mentorship, networking, peer support, and community engagement. In each grade-specific group, Leaders participate in fun and engaging activities, learning the importance of advocacy and social justice through weekly meetings and volunteer opportunities, where they are challenged to give back to the community. Field trips and social events are enjoyed throughout the year.



Middle and High School participants will engage in healthy movement, an essential part of learning and growth. This includes components of physical activity such as dance and interactive games. This not only encourages fitness but also builds confidence, supports creative self-expression, and promotes habits of staying healthy.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

Program Payments - Monthly Draft

All our regularly scheduled programs are on a convenient low monthly draft payment plan. Program fees are charged in monthly installments with varying monthly rates based on the number of scheduled meeting days for your participant's program in each month. Your payment plan will be detailed during the checkout process and on completed receipts.

With the monthly draft design, families register for programs just one time; and seamlessly we will continue to draft your payment each month until you provide notice to stop. The monthly draft method is convenient and helpful in establishing routine schedules for your family! No need to register "every 12 weeks" or "session," the convenient monthly draft promotes registration ease while your child enjoys a seamless and uninterrupted Girls Inc. experience. In addition, starting or stopping your monthly draft is easy.

Membership

All regular program participants are required to have an annual Girls Inc. membership. The membership fee is \$40 (non-refundable). See [page 1](#), call, or visit our website to learn about Girls Inc. membership benefits.

Payment Options

Girls Inc. accepts cash, check, or credit card (Mastercard, Visa, Discover, American Express) payments. We offer scheduled monthly draft payments or full payment upon registration. Please contact our office for assistance with scheduled payment plans.

Scheduled Billing

When enrolling, you authorize Girls Inc. to automatically charge a credit card or other pre-arranged method each month for payment of your enrollment, unless payment is made in full pay upon registration.

Should your scheduled payment(s) decline, you will be notified to confirm or update your card information. A lack of response may result in removal of the payment arrangement and interruption of services.

If you feel that you have experienced a sudden change in financial circumstances, please notify management as soon as possible and see [page 17](#) for steps to apply for EVERY Girl Financial Assistance.

Program Withdrawal/Refund Requests

General Policies

- Should you choose to withdraw from or change a program enrollment, GICCT must be notified in writing (email withdraw@girlsinccentralct.org) at least 14 days prior to the next draft payment. You are responsible for any outstanding balance(s) due for any time enrolled that has not yet been paid.
- Withdrawal due to a medical condition or relocation qualifies for a refund or removal of further scheduled payments (documentation is required). Refunds require 2-4 weeks for processing.
- If payment was made in full at time of registration, the parent/caregiver may choose to maintain an account credit on the participant's profile to use toward future programming or request a prorated refund.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

Program Withdrawal/Refund Requests (Continued)

- Withdrawal for reasons other than medical or relocation will result in a program credit only.
- We reserve the right to cancel any program that fails to meet minimum enrollment and provide a full refund of fees paid. Class days cancelled for inclement weather, or classes missed due to participant absence, will not be refunded, credited, or rescheduled.
- All credit/refund requests are subject to management approval.

EVERY Girl Financial Assistance

Girls Inc.'s EVERY Girl Financial Assistance program, seeks to provide access to evidence-based programming in a pro-girl environment to "every girl" that wants it, regardless of their family's ability to pay.

Financial Assistance is limited and awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. Some restrictions apply. Applications require proof of income received in support of the applying household, whether employment income or alternate income such as unemployment, child support/alimony.

Applicants receiving government assistance (i.e. Child Care Assistance/State Subsidy; HUD/Section 8; Medicaid/All Kids; SNAP; SSI Disability, WIC) may be fast-tracked without requiring proof of income. Please contact the main office for assistance.

EVERY Girl Financial Assistance cannot be combined with other discounts and does not cover Girls Inc. annual membership.

FAQ's

Q: "I'm not sure I will be able to afford this..."

A: For our September-June programs, monthly payments are smaller and easier than paying the total amount upfront.

Q: "Can I pay for programs in full when I register rather than using the monthly draft?"

A: Yes, this is an option.

Q: "How do I cancel my monthly payments?"

A: Just fill out a withdrawal request at least 14 days before your next payment, and we'll withdraw you or your child from the program and cancel future charges.

Q: "Can I change programs mid-year?"

A: Sure! Just fill out a program transfer form.

Q: "Are there refunds if I miss a class?"

A: Only under certain circumstances. Remember, we're planning for and staffing for your child to be present regardless of whether or not you attend. Refund requests may be granted in the case of certain circumstances provided they are submitted with proper documentation (e.g. medical, relocation).

Q: "Do I have my choice of automatic payment dates?"

A: For your convenience, you can choose the day of the month your monthly payment is drafted.

Q: "What happens if my automatic payment bounces?"

A: You'll receive a notification with easy instructions on how to take care of your balance through the main office.

Q: "What if I want to change credit cards mid-year?"

A: Easy! You can edit your payment details through the main office.
