

Members enjoy social gatherings, spiritual enrichment, and meaningful outreach, from monthly meals and game days to special outings like symphony performances, art tours, and seasonal events. # Outreach Focus

## SAPA UN SCHOOL

### Sacred Heart & St. Francis Lakota Mission in South Dakota: Relationship and Service in Action

In Summer 2025, seven Sacred Heart parishioners traveled to the Lakota Rosebud Reservation in St. Francis, South Dakota, the poorest county in the United States, for a week of faith-filled service with local children and families. This visit continued our eight-year Sister School–Sister Parish relationship with St. Francis Mission, which serves the whole person through five parishes, a recovery center, a cultural center, and Sapa Un Academy, a 50-student Nativity Model School at the heart of its work. Volunteers supported students at camp, joined in community traditions, and helped with the local garden, a hopeful response to food insecurity on the reservation.


