What is a Public Charter School?

- Public school-of-choice, no tuition (no admissions tests to enroll)
- Lottery-based enrollment due to the smaller school size
- Mission-specific
- Accountable to the Maryland State Department of Education, Charles County Board of Education, and the Charles County community
- Teachers are part of the local teachers union





Charter Schools in Maryland

- Maryland charter schools are public schools operated by independent nonprofit organizations.
- The charter is awarded by the local board of education and grants the school more operational autonomy than non-charter (traditional) public schools.
 - Public charter schools are tuition-free and open to all students.
 - LEAs manage the application, renewal, and revocation/closure processes in a similar manner to traditional nonpublic schools, while honoring the autonomy in the respective charter agreements.

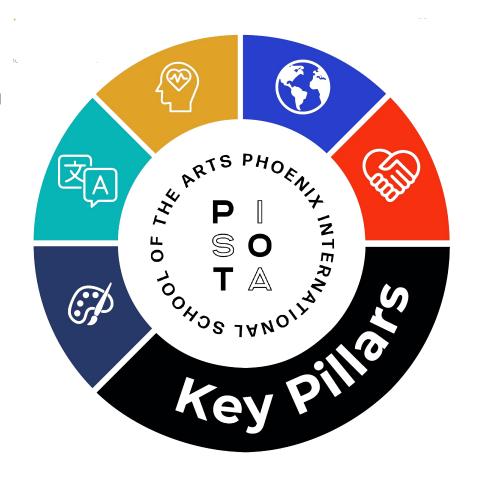

Arts at PISOTA

PISOTA approaches school through a critical arts lens at a significant transition point in youth development - pre-adolescence - by leveraging artistic expression as a transformative tool for learning, healing, and social change. Key aspects include:

Pedagogical Framework:

- Arts integration across core subjects enhances cognitive development and critical thinking

Healing and Wellbeing:

- Creative expression builds resilience and positive self-concept
- Collective art experiences foster belonging and peer support

Academic Impact:

- Higher engagement and attendance in arts-integrated programs
- Improved performance across subjects, particularly reading and math
- Enhanced executive function and memory through multimodal learning

Social Justice Applications:

- Art as tool for examining power structures and inequities
- Student-led creative activism addressing community challenges

This approach frames arts not just as subjects to study, but as essential practices for personal growth, academic achievement, and social transformation.

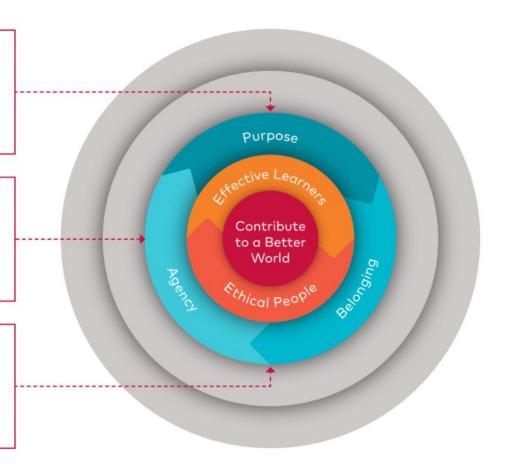

Day-in-the-Life

BY THE NUMBERS

- 180 school days
- English/Language Arts (not including Arts Conservatory literature): approximately 270 minutes (4.5 hours) per week
- Mathematics: approximately 290 minutes (4.8 hours) per week
- **Science:** approximately 290 minutes (4.8 hours) per week
- World Languages: approximately 300 minutes (5 hours) per week
- History (not including Global Perspectives): approximately 180 minutes (3 hours) per week
- Global Perspectives: approximately 120 minutes (2 hours) per week
- Arts Discipline (not including arts-integration in core subjects): approximately 300 minutes (5 hours) per week



Transportation is currently offered through CCPS Bus System, but could be subject to change.

Enrollment Information

Enrollment: Important Dates

Enrollment at Phoenix International School of the Arts is based on a fair and equitable system that provides for an Open Enrollment period; a lottery, if necessary; and a waiting list.

SY 2026 - 2027

 Open Enrollment Period - Oct. 21, 2025 at Noon - Nov. 24, 2025 at Noon

The Open Enrollment period is a designated period prior to the start of each school year when parents/guardians can complete an enrollment application for each new scholar desiring to attend PISOTA.

- Waiting List Opens Nov. 24, 2025 at 12:01 PM EST

 Applicants who are not randomly selected for enrollment through the lottery process will be placed on a grade-specific waitlist based on the lottery results.
- Lottery (if needed) Dec. 11, 2025
 The lottery is an electronic system that randomly identifies students for enrollment.
- Lottery Offers Close Dec. 29, 2025

 Families selected through the digital lottery, must accept their spot by February 9, 2025 prior to 11:59 PM. After this date, the lottery offers will close and the families on the waiting list will begin receiving offers on a first come, first served basis.

Enrollment: Placement Auditions + Portfolio Review

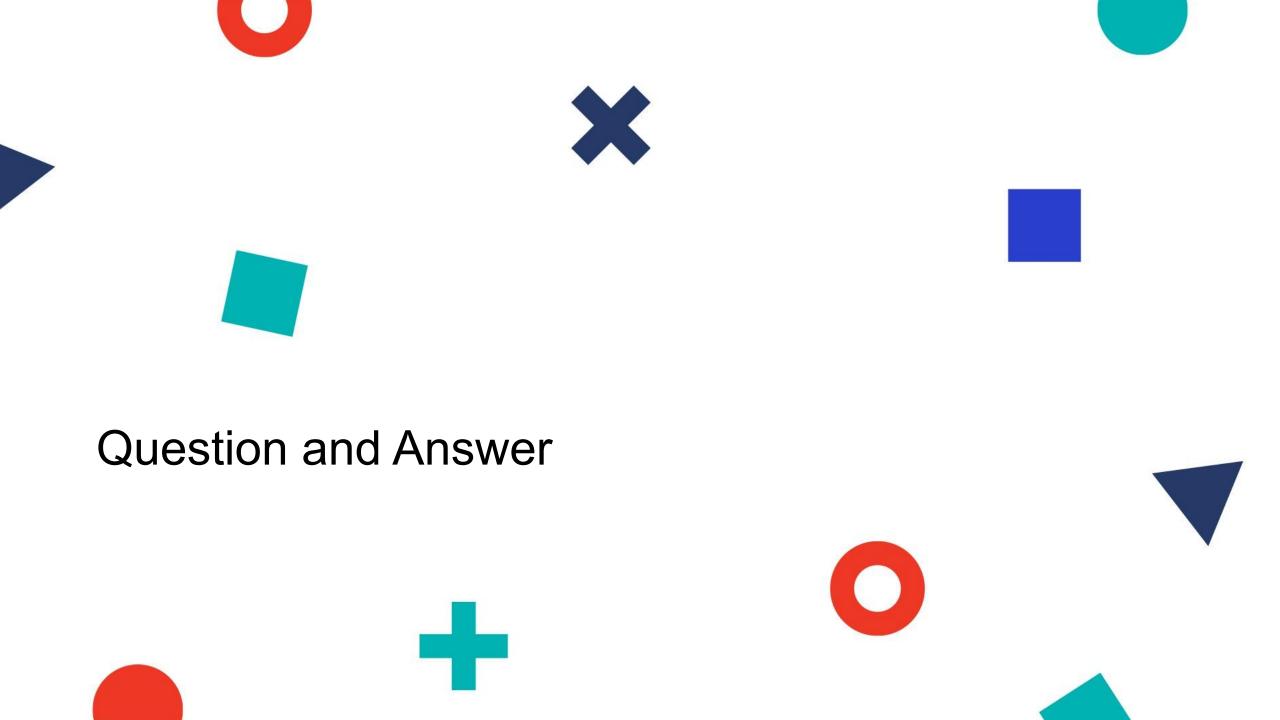
To aid in the class schedule creation process and to ensure scholars are placed in the correct level for their arts pathway courses, we are implementing placement evaluations and portfolio reviews.

- Who is this for? Scholars selected in the lottery
- When? Appointments will be scheduled beginning Jan. 25 Feb. 22
- Instrumental, Vocal, Acting, and Dance will complete a performance evaluation
- Visual Art will complete a written survey and portfolio review
- Additional details about what to prepare will be emailed to all applicants
