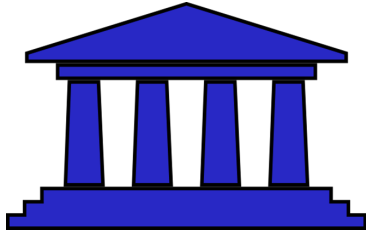


School Governance Council
