We hope this newsletter finds you and your family well as we welcome the month of November and the beginning of the holiday season.

October was a busy and exciting month here at Laddie A. Decker Sound Beach School! Our fifth grade students enjoyed a memorable trip to the Bronx Zoo, and all of our students had visits from the local fire department to learn about fire safety. In addition, students participated in a DASA lesson focused on kindness and inclusivity.

Classroom routines are now well established, and we are fully immersed in our curriculum. Halloween was a festive day, with students dressing up in costumes and enjoying themed lessons and celebrations. Our music program is in full swing, with lessons underway and our concert ensembles meeting in the morning.

This month's school-wide theme is gratitude. Our guidance department will continue classroom visits to deliver character education lessons centered on thankfulness and giving. We are also excited to launch the "Battle of the Grades" Food Drive, running from November 3rd through December 12th. A list of requested items by grade level can be found on our school website. We're thrilled to announce that Jared Campbell, an award-winning singer/songwriter from New York, will be performing for our students on November 19th. Jared's music delivers powerful messages about motivation, kindness, and anti-bullying, and we are looking forward to this inspiring assembly.

Throughout November, we will also be honoring our veterans in recognition of Veterans Day. We are deeply grateful for the sacrifices made by our servicemen and women, past and present. We thank them for their courage, strength, and dedication to our country.

This year, we're proud to introduce a new building-wide initiative developed by our School Improvement Team: The ROAR Initiative. At our ROAR Assembly on October 16th, student volunteers helped introduce this program by modeling key positive behavior traits and social-emotional skills that represent what it means to "show your ROAR." Throughout the year, teachers and staff will nominate two students per class who consistently demonstrate these traits. Recognized students will receive a Certificate of ROAR and a homework pass. Third Grade Thoughts...

Our third graders are learning so much! We are finishing up Module 1 of our reading program, HMH *Into Reading*, where students are exploring what makes characters interesting. As we begin Module 2, the students are excited to learn about poetry and letters in order to build their knowledge about how people express themselves. In Math, our students learned the foundational skills of mul-



tiplication and division, and are moving onto learning about place value and problem solving with units of measure. We are beginning our weather unit, which has been an engaging unit for the third graders; from analyzing weather patterns to learning about weather tools, our students love being meteorologists!



Many of our third grade classes had a wonderful opportunity to experience, two incredible authors, Jeff Kinney and Pete Oswald, streaming live into their classrooms! Jeff Kinney, the author of <u>Diary of a Wimpy Kid</u>, gave us a virtual tour of his creative workspace (which was inspired by his books), challenged us with trivia, read a sneak peek from his new book, and even showed us how to design our own characters. To top it off, he surprised everyone by announcing his upcoming movie, "Diary of a Wimpy Kid: The Last Straw", coming out this December!

Next, we met Pete Oswald, the author and illustrator of <u>The Big Cheese</u>, <u>The</u> Bad Seed, The Smart Cookie, and more. He shared what inspires his stories, got us

moving with a fun "workout warm-up," read <u>The Big Cheese</u>, and taught us how to draw the main character ourselves. It was such an exciting day of creativity, laughter, and inspiration!

Fourth Grade Focus ...

Fourth grade students are using technology daily, including Google Classroom, to enhance their learning experiences. In math, we've completed Module 1 and are now working on Module 2: Conversions and Problem Solving with Metric Measurement, focusing on length, mass, and capacity. Lessons and assignments can be found on the Engage NY website. Please ensure your child practices multiplication facts up to 12s daily or uses REFLEX Math for fluency.





During reading, students are exploring various genres through the HMH *Into Reading* series. They are practicing skills such as retelling, summarizing, identifying main ideas and details, recognizing problem/solution, theme, and figurative language. Encourage your child to read at least 20 minutes each night to strengthen comprehension and fluency.

In science, we're studying "A Walk in the Park," focusing on how plants and animals interact

within ecosystems. Students enjoyed our field trip to Miller Place Pond, where they conducted a scavenger hunt and made real-world observations.

During social studies, we are continuing our study of New York's geography, regions, and resources. Students are learning to read and interpret maps as we begin our new unit on the Native People of New York. Please continue checking take-home folders and agenda books daily to help your child stay organized. Thank you for your ongoing support in making learning meaningful!



Fifth Grade Flash...

What a great start to the school year! The students have been adjusting nicely and we have been diving into the curriculum as well as making new friendships.

Academically, we have been moving right along! In Math, we are well into Module 2 which is multiplication and division. Memorizing multiplication facts at home is a great way for students to practice and be prepared for the upcoming lessons. In ELA, we have been focusing on the HMH curriculum but will be getting into novels shortly.

We have also started our "Toy's Matter" unit which is a kit with many different hands-on lessons for the students. They really enjoy learning and exploring matter through this unit. We have started our ancient civilizations unit and students are enjoying learning about the Aztec, Incan and Mayan civilizations.

Our fifth grade students enjoyed a wonderful field trip to the Bronx Zoo. It was a beautiful fall day, the sun was shining, and the park was peaceful and quiet. Students had an exciting opportunity to explore the zoo's newest exhibit, *The World of Darkness*, which featured bats, sloths, snakes, and other fascinating reptiles. Here the students observed animals from around the world, learning about their habitats, behaviors, and conservation efforts. They were especially curious about how nocturnal animals adapt to life in the dark.









One of the highlights of the day was the Wild Asia Monorail, where students took a scenic tour through the Asian habitats of the zoo. From the comfort of the monorail, they spotted elephants, rhinos, and tigers while learning about the unique environments these animals call home. The ride gave everyone a new appreciation for the diversity of wildlife across the world.









Throughout the trip, students demonstrated curiosity and enthusiasm, asking thoughtful questions and making connections to what they've been learning in science class. Teachers and chaperones were proud of how respectful and engaged everyone was. It was truly a memorable day filled with learning, exploration, and joy!

The time is flying and before we know it, it will be Thanksgiving break. We are so proud of our fifth graders and are looking forward to a wonderful year.

As always, we are so grateful for the generosity shown by the LADSBS students, staff, and families.

Last month, the Miller Place and Sound Beach Fire Departments visited LADSBS to teach students in grades 3-5 all about fire safety. During their presentation, firefighters and EMTs discussed important topics such as how to properly use smoke detectors, why it's important to keep bedroom doors closed at night, and what to do in the event of a fire at home.



Students had the opportunity to ask questions, explore some of the firefighters' gear, and learn firsthand about the tools and equipment used in emergency situations. The firefighters emphasized the importance of staying calm, having a plan, and practicing fire drills at home, just like they do at school.

At the end of the visit, the firefighters gave the students a special "homework" assignment: to work with their families to create a home fire escape plan and choose a safe meeting spot outside. This hands-on activity encourages families to talk about safety together and make sure everyone knows what to do in case of an emergency.

The LADSBS community extends a heartfelt thank you to the Miller Place and Sound Beach Fire Departments for taking the time to educate our students and help keep our community safe!


Throughout the year, teachers and staff will nominate two students per class who consistently demonstrate these traits, resulting in a total of eight nominations. Our ROAR values include:

Helpful Hints...

- Early Pick Up: When you know ahead of time that you will be picking your child up from school, it is very helpful that you send a note in to that effect. If your appointment/plans are cancelled and you find you no longer need to pick your child up, please call to let us know. When we have a note saying that a parent will be picking a child up from school, we will not send him/her on the bus unless we receive a call.
- Emergency Closing Information: Green "Emergency Closing" forms were sent home over the summer. If you have not already done so, please provide information as to how your child will travel home in the event of an early school closing due to an emergency or inclement weather. If your child attends SCOPE after-school child care, be reminded that after-care closes in the event of an emergency early dismissal. Please let us know your alternate arrangements, and make sure to have the forms back to us before November 7th.
- <u>Lost and Found:</u> If your child is missing an item, please remind them to check our Lost and Found. All unclaimed items will be donated before the Holiday Break.
