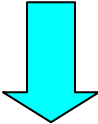

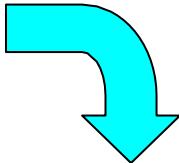
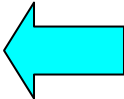

	Improve staff capacity to provide high-quality instruction.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● By January 2026, 70% of SPOT observation scores will be proficient or higher, and will increase to 80% by May 2026 ● By the end of the year, at least 85% of teachers will earn a rating of Proficient or higher on campus-based SPOT observations, as verified through calibration with the Executive Director. ● By the end of the school year, 6th grade students will reach the 60th percentile in Reading, and 8th grade students will reach the 50th percentile in Math on the NWEA MAP assessment, demonstrating measurable academic growth.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Train teachers on the “Great 8 and the Next 8” during August professional development and reinforce these practices throughout the year during campus PD days. ● Provide regular on-the-job coaching focused on best practices in the instructional section of the SPOT form. ● Conduct weekly calibration sessions with the instructional leadership team to ensure consistent instructional leadership and impactful coaching.

	Increase English language proficiency and academic achievement for Emergent Bilingual (EB) students.
	Indicators of success <i>(Measurable results that describe success.)</i>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● By the end of the 2025-2026 academic year, 50% of students will increase their TELPAS composite proficiency level by at least one level compared to their previous year’s score, demonstrating measurable language proficiency growth. ● By the end of the 2025-2026 academic year, the percentage of 6th-grade Emergent Bilingual students reclassified from EB to Monitored status, according to TEA Reclassification Criteria, will increase from 25% in 2024-2025 to 30% ● By the end of the 2025-2026 academic year, the percentage of 8th-grade Emergent Bilingual students reclassified from EB to Monitored status, according to TEA Reclassification Criteria, will increase from 27% in 2024-2025 to 32%.
