Provide exit criteria information sent: Students can be exited based on foundational skills. They should be at benchmark for accuracy in STAR CBM Data and at benchmark or at risk for fluency. They should demonstrate mastery of in-program assessments with 90% accuracy or higher on skills taught in program. They should also demonstrate mastery of a majority of phonics skills taught that their grade level based on STAR Phonics data.
