This test measures the critical reading, math problem solving and writing skills. It provides:

- Practice for the SAT Reasoning Test
- Feedback on your strengths and weaknesses for college study skills
- A chance to qualify for National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship programs
- Information from colleges when you check “yes” to Student Search Service.

The PSAT/NMSQT is for **juniors**. Sophomores may take the test. You will receive information about this test from your school in the month of September. The university will expand its use of multiple measures to assess academic readiness of students. These measures include, but are not limited to, high school grades and GPA, grades in collegiate courses, ACT and SAT scores, Advanced Placement test scores and Smarter Balanced Assessment scores. The CSU's current English Placement Test (EPT) and Entry-Level Mathematics (ELM) tests will be retired.

California Community Colleges

For the first time in decades, high school transcripts, coursework and grades will count more than placement testing. Starting in fall 2019, students will no longer be required to take English and math placement tests when enrolling in a California community college.

SAT 1 (reasoning)

SAT II (Subject Tests)

SAT II is a one-hour test in specific subject areas. Many colleges use these exams as an indication of subject mastery and as an entrance requirement.
