## What are some of the learning outcomes from this course?:

Students explore Michigan's natural and cultural treasures through handson experiences and lessons. We've visited Mackinac Island, the U.P., and mining sites; learned about forestry with the DNR; and discovered mushroom houses, secret gardens, and wildlife centers. We've also attended performances like STOMP, The Lion King, and Blue Man Group at Miller Auditorium. Each trip connects to Globe lessons and learning goals. A highlight is our Inland Seas trip, where students build ROVs, study Lake Michigan's chemistry, and collect PLAYBIL real data on freshwater
