Experiencing Art and Technology has been offered at GLVP for 15 years. It's now called Field Experience: Art and Technology, and next year it will get a new name!

Application Information:

We are referred to as EAT or Field Trips. There is a minimum of 18 field trips offered each semester.

Favorite Part About This Application:

I love exploring Michigan and sharing the hidden gems of our State. I am so happy families will explore Michigan with me. We are so fortunate that our district supports our adventures.

What are some of the learning outcomes from this course?:

Students explore Michigan's natural and cultural treasures through hands-on experiences and lessons. We've visited Mackinac Island, the U.P., and mining sites; learned about forestry with the DNR; and discovered mushroom houses, secret gardens, and wildlife centers. We've also attended performances like *STOMP*, *The Lion King*, and *Blue Man Group* at Miller Auditorium. Each trip connects to Globe lessons and learning goals. A highlight is our Inland Seas trip, where students build ROVs, study Lake Michigan's chemistry, and collect real data on freshwater health.
