



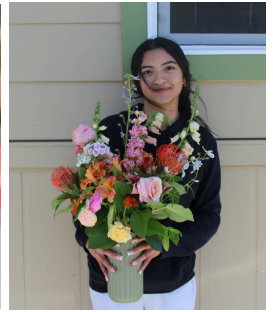
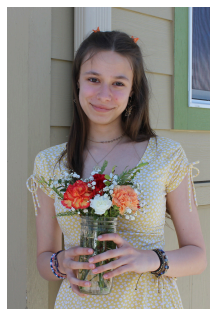

Student Experiences

Floral Pathway students **get hands-on training in the techniques, and skills currently practiced in the floral design industry.** Learning includes:

- Construction of corsages, floral arrangements and wedding flowers
- Introductory ornamental horticulture
- Identification of plants and flowers
- Professional industry standards and expectations

Membership in **Future Farmers of America (FFA)** provides pathway students with the opportunity to participate in regional, state, and national competitions.

College & Career Ready

Real-world learning experiences lead to the **development interpersonal and professional skills** in communication, critical thinking, teamwork, leadership, and work ethic. Skills learned include:

- Applied art principles
- Cut flower care & handling practices
- Use of florist tools and materials
- Marketing of floral products and use of current floral business technology

Students develop the basic skills to participate in an **internship** or seek **employment** with local businesses.

Students earn **UC/CSU "F" art credit** and are prepared to enter a **degree program** in Agriculture and Horticulture or the work force.
