

Scholarship Program 2027





The All Saints' College Scholarship Program exists in order to acknowledge excellence and in order to support a community characterised by diversity – diversity of abilities and talents, interests and backgrounds.

The Program aims to recognise students who will make a strong and positive contribution to the life of All Saints' College.



Academic Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic excellence, as evidenced in the student's performance in the scholarship examination and interview.

Academic Scholarships are available to students entering **Year 5**, **Year 7** and **Year 10** in **2027**. These scholarships are open to both current All Saints' College students and students not yet enrolled at the College. The value of the scholarship is **50% of the College's academic tuition fee**.

The Academic Scholarships are run by <u>Academic</u> <u>Assessment Services</u>, which conduct examinations for many schools across the country. The Scholarship examination assesses students in:

- > Abstract Reasoning and Problem Solving
- > Mathematics Achievement and Reasoning
- > Reading Comprehension
- > Written Expression

All students <u>must</u> sit the scholarship examination.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Scholarship exists to recognise a student with a demonstrated commitment to their community and is of Indigenous descent. Students will be selected, on the basis of academic potential, personal commitment and family support for an All Saints' College education.

This scholarship is for students entering **Year 5 or above in 2027**. These scholarships are open to both current All Saints' College students and students not yet enrolled at the College. The scholarship can cover up to **100% tuition fees** (dependent on financial statements) and may include other expenses, including year level and other charges, textbooks, stationery, uniforms, ICT charge, camp costs and other incidentals. No academic examinations are required.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Applicants are required to submit the following with their application:

- A copy of the student's most recent academic report
- A copy of the student's most recent NAPLAN results
- > A copy of the student's birth certificate
- > A letter of endorsement from a community leader or supporting family member
- > A letter of endorsement from the student's current Principal

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the College Principal and/or Director of Senior School (Student Wellbeing).



ENTRY TO YEARS 7 TO 12 IN 2027

Performing Arts Scholarships are awarded to talented and dedicated students in Drama and Dance, entering Years 7 to 12 in 2027.

Scholarships are offered following an audition process. The value is **50% of the College's academic tuition fee**. These scholarships are open to both current All Saints' College students and students not yet enrolled at the College.

Recipients are also expected to maintain a sound standard of academic achievement. Should a student fail to demonstrate satisfactory academic progress or commitment to the Performing Arts program, the College reserves the right to review or withdraw the scholarship.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Applicants are required to submit the following with their application:

- > How long they have been involved in their chosen Performing Arts (Dance/Drama)
- A covering letter of up to 300 words addressing their experience, passion and involvement in their chosen Performing Arts area
- > Copy of the applicant's most recent academic report
- Copy of the applicant's most recent NAPLAN results
- > Copy of the applicant's birth certificate

DRAMA AUDITION REQUIREMENTS			
Workshop	Group workshop to extend skills; voice, movement, character and improvisation.	30 minutes	
Published monologue (Five monologues will be provided to shortlisted applicants prior to the audition to choose from)	The candidate chooses a scripted monologue. The performance should highlight the candidate's acting strengths. A chair and table will be provided. The candidate will be given one minute to prepare once they enter the audition space.	2 – 3 minutes	
Question	Candidates will be asked a question relative to drama and their perception of the wider world.	3 minutes	

DANCE AUDITION REQUIREMENTS		
Workshop	Contemporary technique class. Students need to wear fitted attire and bare feet.	45 minutes
Dance Solo	The candidate is to choose a solo composition in the genre of their choice. The performance should highlight the candidate's strengths. The candidate will be given one minute to prepare once they enter the audition space. The audition space will be 10m x 8m.	1 – 2 minutes
Question	Candidates will be asked a question related to dance and their perception of the wider world.	3 minutes

As part of our commitment to fostering future-enabled, creative-thinking entrepreneurs who see problems as opportunities and who model a 'start-up' mindset, All Saints' College strives to be a leader in student-centric learning and in enterprise and innovation.

The Innovation and Entrepreneurship Scholarship is eligible for **new students not currently attending All Saints' College entering Years 5 to 11 in 2027**. The value is **50% of the College's academic tuition fee**.

This scholarship is a unique opportunity for a young person with a demonstrated flair for, and experience in, innovation, invention, 'start-up' thinking and entrepreneurship to join our community.

The College has a number of initiatives designed to foster an entrepreneurial mindset. These include, but are not limited to: **InnovatED**, a course facilitated by a multi-disciplinary team of teachers, in which students engage in problemfinding, collaboration, and design thinking to codesign a curriculum that reflects their passions, interests, and concerns; **Runway**, our pop-up shop dedicated to showcasing the goods and services of enterprising young people; and **HotHouse Company**, a unique and experimental arts program that provides opportunities in an 'incubation environment' extending beyond the traditional curriculum.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Applicants are required to submit the following with their application:

- Copy of the student's most recent academic report

- > Two written references that speak to the student's passion for, and skills in, innovation and entrepreneurship

Students will also be required to respond to three questions on the online application.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the College Principal and/or Head of Design Hub.



The Music Scholarship is for students entering Years 7 to 12 in 2027. It recognises an outstanding musician who has attained a high level of performance. These scholarships are open to both current All Saints' College students and students not yet enrolled at the College.

The value of the scholarship is **50% of the College's academic tuition fee and 100% of the 30-minute music lesson tuition fees**. The scholarship is for the duration of the student's attendance at the College and is conditional upon ongoing excellence in, and commitment to, the All Saints' Music Program.

An audition to select shortlisted candidates is an integral part of the process of awarding scholarships.

ELIGIBILITY FOR MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

- > **Piano:** A performance level of at least Grade 8 AMEB standard is expected from applicants.
- > Violin, Cello, Viola and Double Bass: A performance level of at least Grade 4 AMEB standard is expected from applicants.
- > Woodwind and Brass Instruments:
 As students usually commence learning a wind instrument in Years 4 or 5, evidence of outstanding progress within the time of learning is required.
- > **Singers:** Minimum of two years tuition with evidence of outstanding performances in productions, eisteddfods or regular membership of a choir. Singers are expected to maintain commitment to the Choral Program.
- > **Guitar & Percussionists:** Minimum of two years tuition on instrument with evidence of outstanding performance.



Students who play two instruments should have a performance level of at least Grade 4 in one of the instruments. Exceptions apply for piano, which must be at Grade 8 level if it is the primary instrument. Whilst achievement in formal music examinations is not mandatory, students should be able to demonstrate the required level of performance.

Applicants are required to submit the following with their application:

- > Copies of any awards for musical performance eg Eisteddfods
- > Copies of recent music examination results
- > Reference letter from current instrumental teacher, which includes details on practice ethic and progress.
- > Copy of the applicant's most recent academic report
- > Copy of the applicant's most recent NAPLAN results
- > Copy of the applicant's birth certificate

Music Audition Requirements

- > Perform two works of a contrasting nature - not exceeding 12 minutes in total
- > Undergo an aural test, comprising pitch matching, clapping of rhythm, singing of intervals and singing a melody which has been played twice.

Students who study two instruments must choose only one instrument for the audition - this is their primary instrument.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the College Principal and/or Director of Music.



As part of our commitment to remaining connected to our past, the College works with a wide range of stakeholders, including the Old Saints, to develop and optimise opportunities for our former students and their families.

The Old Saints' Scholarship is offered on behalf of the alumni of All Saints' College and may be awarded to a child of former students (Old Saints) entering **Year 7 in 2027**. The recipient of this scholarship will be recognised as having sound academic results and strong community values.

Further, the recipient might be a young person who would otherwise not be able to join this community due to financial constraints. The value of the Old Saints' Scholarship is **50% of the College's** academic tuition fee

- Copy of the student's most recent academic report
- Copy of the student's most recent NAPLAN results
- > Copy of the student's birth certificate

Frequently Asked Questions

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

What types of scholarships does All Saints' College offer?

The College offers a range of scholarships, including Academic Scholarships, Performing Arts Scholarships (Drama and Dance), Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Heritage Scholarship, Innovation & Entrepreneurship, Music Scholarships, and an Old Saints' Scholarship. Each has its own eligibility criteria, application process, and benefits.

Who can apply for scholarships? Are they open to current students as well as new students?

All scholarships are open to both current All Saints' College students and students not yet enrolled at the College, except the Innovation & Entrepreneurship Scholarship – this is only applicable for external students who are not currently enrolled.

What costs are covered by a scholarship?

All scholarships generally cover 50% of the tuition fees. The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Scholarship may cover up to 100% of tuition fees (depending on financial circumstances), and the Music Scholarship also covers 100% of the 30-minute music lesson tuition fees. Other charges including Year Level, subject charges, textbooks, uniforms, ICT charges, camp costs and incidentals, are usually excluded from the scholarship.

How long does a scholarship last?

Scholarships are awarded for the duration of a student's enrolment at the College, provided the conditions of the scholarship continue to be met.

ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATIONS

How do I know if my child is eligible to apply?

Each scholarship has specific entry requirements. For further details, read the information in this booklet for each category.

Can students apply for more than one scholarship category?

Yes, students may apply for more than one scholarship if they meet the eligibility criteria for each. Separate applications are required, and there are separate fees associated with each application. Please note that a student can only be awarded one scholarship.

Do students need to be Australian citizens or permanent residents to apply?

Students applying for scholarships must provide proof of citizenship or residency. A copy of the birth certificate (or equivalent documentation) is required with all applications.

What supporting documents are required for a scholarship application?

Supporting documentation varies slightly, but generally includes the student's most recent academic report, most recent NAPLAN results and copy of the student's birth certificate. Some scholarships also require proof of participation in the various field, endorsement letters from community leaders or the current Principal. Check each program for required documentation.

Is there an application fee, and is it refundable?

All scholarships have associated application fees. Academic (\$150), Dance, Drama, Music and Innovation (\$100), Old Saints (\$50) and no fee for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholarship. All application fees are non-refundable and nontransferable.

Frequently Asked Questions

EXAMINATIONS & AUDITIONS

What is involved in the Academic scholarship examination?

All students applying for Academic Scholarships must sit the scholarship examination, which assesses a range of academic skills. The exam is conducted on a set date at the College and typically runs over three hours, with a 15-minute morning tea break in between. The examination is run by Academic Assessment Services (AAS).

Are past exam papers or practice materials available?

Sample papers are not provided, however AAS do have online practice tests which can be accessed here: **Online Practice Tests | AAS**

What is the audition process for Music, Dance and Drama Scholarships?

Students applying for Music, Dance and Drama Scholarships are invited to audition in their chosen discipline. Details of the audition process will be provided once applications close. Learn more about the audition processes on the program pages in this booklet.

When and where are the examinations/auditions held?

Examinations and auditions are held **on campus at All Saints' College**.

- > Academic Scholarship exam: Saturday 2 May 2026
- Dance/Drama Scholarship audition: Saturday 23 May 2026
- > Music Scholarship audition: Saturday 21 February 2026

What happens if my child is unable to attend the scheduled exam or audition date?

Attendance at the scheduled exam/audition is a requirement. Unfortunately, alternative dates are not scheduled; however, in the event of extenuating circumstances, online submission/participation may be allowed. This will be decided on a case-by-case basis.

SELECTION & OUTCOMES

How are scholarship recipients selected?

Selection is based on the criteria of each scholarship. Academic results, audition performance, and supporting documentation are all considered, along with interviews where required. The number of scholarship recipients varies each year, and is dependent upon a number of factors.

Will applicants be interviewed as part of the process?

Yes. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to attend an interview as part of the selection process.

When will families be notified of the outcome?

Families will be notified after the selection process is complete. Notification timelines vary by scholarship type, however, all families will be notified via email of the outcome (whether successful or unsuccessful), typically by the end of Term 2 2026 (July).

Will I receive my child's individual results from the Academic Scholarship Examination?

No. Students sitting the Scholarship Examination do not receive individual performance reports. Marks are confidential and cannot be disclosed under any circumstances.

How many scholarships are awarded each year?

The All Saints' College Scholarship Program is very competitive, with a limited number of scholarships offered each year for each category. The number may vary depending on the applicant pool and available places, which change from year to year.

If my child is unsuccessful, can they reapply in future years?

Yes. Students are welcome to reapply in later scholarship rounds if eligible.

Frequently Asked Questions

CONDITIONS & COMMITMENTS

What are the expectations of scholarship holders?

Recipients are expected to maintain sound academic performance and remain committed to the relevant program (e.g. Music, Dance, Drama, Innovation or Academic excellence), and contribute positively to College life.

What happens if a student's academic performance declines?

Scholarships are conditional on continued commitment and satisfactory progress. If performance or engagement falls short, the College reserves the right to review or withdraw the scholarship.

What happens if I accept a scholarship offer but later withdraw my child from All Saints' College?

If an enrolment is cancelled after the conclusion of Term 3 in the year prior to commencement, but before the student's confirmed start year, a penalty equivalent to one quarter of the annual tuition fee will be payable within two weeks of giving notice of withdrawal.
