

ALL-COUNTY I MUSIC FESTIVAL



WILLIAM MUTHIG SELECTED FOR CONFERENCE ALL-STATE

Each year hundreds of students participate in NYSSMA Solo Festival with the hope of achieving a perfect score that will secure their way into one of the Conference All-State Ensemble. This year, for only the second time in 24 years, West Canada Valley will be represented by an instrumental student in this elite festival. **William Muthig** has been chosen to participate in the NYSSMA Conference All-State Symphonic Band on the Flute 1 part. To achieve this distinct honor, William played a Level 6 (college/professional level) solo entitled, “*The Carnival of Venice*” by Briccialdi and scored a perfect 100. Across the state of New York, hundreds of flutists auditioned for this ensemble and dozens received perfect scores. From these auditionees, William was chosen as one of 24 flutists to participate in the ensemble. In addition to William, Herkimer County has just one other student participation – Landon Ploss from Herkimer will be participating in the Mixed Chorus. William is just one of five students in Zone 4 (Oswego County, Oneida County, and Herkimer County) to be chosen to play in Symphonic Band. William studies with Mrs. Shane Bonney.

The festival will occur December 4-7, 2025 in Rochester, with a culminating concert to be held at the Eastman School of Music on December 7th.

FROM OUR SCHOOL NURSES

The winter sports season is here! Parents/guardians have been contacted by the school nurse if their student needs an updated physical for the sports season.

- If you have not already done so, **please get physicals in by November 18th** so your student may participate in the winter sport season they signed up for.
- **Please make sure the pink forms (interval athletic history forms) are filled out, along with the athletics handbook as well;** the nurse has to review the pink form **before** the player can begin their season.
- **In regard to the athletics handbook, please review**
 - Concussion Signs and Symptoms
 - Per NYSED Concussion guidelines **“Any student who is suspected of having sustained a concussion be immediately removed from cognitive, athletic, and other physical activities and remain out of cognitive, athletic, and other physical activities until evaluated and cleared to return to activity by a licensed health care provider”**
 - When injured in sports, there is a return to play protocol that the school's medical director has to sign off of before returning to sports, this protocol can take a week or more, please be aware.

Reminders:

- Accidents and spills happen during the school day, especially in our Elementary building. It is helpful if students have an extra change of clothes in their backpack.
- It's the student's responsibility to be prepared for gym class. Please be sure your child has sneakers and clothes to change into (if required) on gym days.

Winter Weather Bus Schedule Reminder

On bad weather days and we still have school; the buses may leave the garage a little earlier to get to their routes. The students that are the first on the bus should be ready 5 to 10 minutes earlier. The students at the end of the run may see their bus arrive 5 to 10 minutes late. This will all vary due to road conditions. Please try to help the bus drivers out on those bad weather days by being patient and understanding.

Things Parents Should Know About School Bus Safety

- School buses are the safest form of highway transportation.
- The most dangerous part of the school bus ride is getting on and off the bus.
- Pedestrian fatalities (while loading and unloading school buses) account for approximately three times as many school bus-related fatalities, when compared to school bus occupant fatalities.
- The loading and unloading area is called the “Danger Zone”.
- The “Danger Zone” is the area on all sides of the bus where children are in the most danger of not being seen by the driver (15 feet in front of the bus where the driver may be too high to see a child, 15 feet on either side of the bus where a child may be in the driver’s blind spot, and the area behind the bus).
- Half of the pedestrian fatalities in school bus-related accidents are children between 5 and 7 years old.
- Young children are most likely to be struck because they:
 - Hurry to get on and off the bus
 - Act before they think and have little experience with traffic
 - Assume motorists will see them and will wait for them to cross the road
 - Don’t always stay within the bus driver’s sight

Things Students Should Know About School Bus Safety

- The bus driver and others cannot see you if you are standing closer than 10 feet to the bus. Stay out of the danger zone.
- If something falls under or near the bus, tell the driver. Never try to pick it up yourself!
- While waiting for the bus, stay in a safe place away from the road.
- When you get on or off the bus, **look for the bus safety lights and make sure they are flashing.**
- Be alert to traffic. When you get on or off the bus, look left, right, left before you exit the bus and before you enter or cross the road.
- When the driver says it is safe to cross the road, remember to cross in front of the bus.
- Stay in your seat and sit quietly so that the driver is not distracted.
- Our school buses have seat belts. We urge you to use them. Learn to use them correctly.
