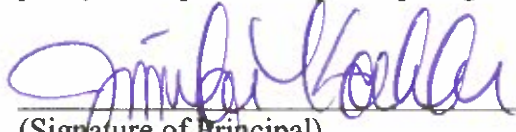
1. Rosenthal Montessori will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:
