# Cornell Cooperative Extension Spotlight



#### **Ice Cream Making**

Learn the history and nutritional value of ice cream while making it the old-fashioned way by hand cranking and enjoy tasting their creations.

#### **Winter Wildlife**

Explore how animals survive winter through migration, hibernation, and adaptation with interactive games and activities. Optional field trip includes a 30-minute farm hike to spot tracks and signs of wildlife.

#### Things that Sting (and things that dont)!

Explore local and global sea creatures that sting or bite, learn why and how they do it, and dispel myths while examining live specimens and artifacts like sea urchins, horseshoe crabs, and coral.

#### So Many Mollusks!

Explore the fascinating world of mollusks—sea snails, squid, and clams by observing and touching live creatures. Includes the optional Super Sea Creatures of LI coloring and guide book.

#### **Sensational Sharks!**

Learn about shark biology, ecology, and conservation while exploring jaws, teeth, eggs, and other artifacts.


Optional craft: make a shark tooth necklace to take home.

#### **Crustacean Exploration**

Discover lobsters and local crustaceans like hermit crabs, Asian shore crabs, and barnacles. Learn about exoskeletons, regeneration, feeding habits, and more. Includes a Super Sea Creatures of LI coloring and guide book.

#### **Insects: Incredible Creatures!**

Learn about insect body structures, lifestyles, habitats, and adaptations, including their roles as pollinators and decomposers. Discover how entomologists identify insects and the importance of metamorphosis in their life cycles.
