


The school orchestra goes under the name of "The Lettermen." It is composed of six of our high school boys. They have provided good music for many of our parties.



West Fargo gained second place honors at the sub-district tournament. Kindred defeated the Packers 41 - 33 to compete in the regionals at Devils Lake. The Packers won over Casselton 22 to 21 in the semi-finals.

The tournament, February 24, 27, and 28, was conducted in a new way this year. It eliminated the districts at Linderwood. School organizations sold ice cream, pop, hot dogs, and coke. The Pep Squad decorated the gymnasium. The Pep Band played between halves and games.

George Christianson, our tall center, led the Packers scoring with a total of 168 points. Arlen Sommers, guard, was second high scorer with 129 points.





The West Fargo Chapter of the Future Homemakers of America can report many achievements. The girls say selling "coke" and hot dogs at our Homemaking game was most fun.


The F. H. A. sponsored the showing of a film, "Junior Prom," in December which everyone really enjoyed. It was not only entertaining but informative as well.


