





Students Efforts Recognized at Annual Awards Assembly



Junior Class Play Was "Absolutely Murder"


The three act mystery-comedy, "Absolutely Murder", was presented on November 8 and 9, 1963, under the direction of Mrs. Spillman.




Physical Fitness Is The Aim of GAA
