


Gridders Finish Season 2-7





The Keys to a peaceful world are communication and understanding; during my stay here I had an opportunity to learn through personal experience what these words can mean. My one year as a foreign exchange student in this country has been the best learning experience I have ever had. I saw different situations, and I involved myself in a new life.

My family in West Fargo was different from my own in Vitoria, but living with them has been a terrific experience. My school participation was also an important part of my life here, and it too was all different from anything I had ever experienced before. At first I needed so much help with the language that I felt like the youngest child along with the other guys—ask, ask, ask. Sometimes I felt like an idiot asking. At the beginning I perhaps felt alone, and I felt that I would never adjust to the attitudes of the people here. But I soon found that the challenge was adjusting to the different way of thinking and understanding, instead of being changed by it. I have a lot to learn yet, a lot of people to get along with every day wherever I live, but the tolerance I tried to practice here will stay with me forever.

My AFS experience in North Dakota was only a beginning. I will take back to Brazil new insights and a more mature self. For all of these things I have to say thanks to everybody.


My trip to Germany was very rewarding and the memories I will cherish forever. I would encourage everyone to get involved in the AFS program. It's worth it!






