

Southam College Sixth Form 2026 Entry Criteria

To be eligible for entry into the Sixth Form, students must achieve the minimum general requirements of at least five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including both English & Maths. In addition, each pathway and subject has its own specific entry requirements, which are detailed below.



Art	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Art & Design and a Grade 5 in English.
Biology	Separate Science: Students must have a Grade 7 in the Science they wish to study with at least a Grade 6 in the others. Students must have a Grade 6 in Mathematics. Combined Science: Students must have a Grade 7,7 in Combined Science with at least a Grade 6 in Mathematics. At the start of the year, all students will sit a 'Head Start Test' to establish a baseline for progress monitoring and to confirm they meet the course requirements.
Business Studies	If Business has been studied at GCSE, a minimum of a Grade 6. It is not necessary for Business to have been studied at GCSE level for it to be taken at A Level. However, students need at least 5 GCSEs at Grade 4 or above including Maths & English at Grade 6 or above.
BTEC Business	A Merit at BTEC Business Level 2 if previously studied. Students who have not studied Business before will require 5 GCSEs at Grade 4 including English and Maths.
Chemistry	Separate Science: Students must have a Grade 7 in the Science they wish to study with at least a Grade 6 in the others. Students must have a Grade 6 in Mathematics. Combined Science: Students must have a Grade 7,7 in Combined Science with at least a Grade 6 in Mathematics. At the start of the year, all students will sit a 'Head Start Test' to establish a baseline for progress monitoring and to confirm they meet the course requirements.
Computer Science	If Computer Science has been studied at GCSE, a minimum of a Grade 6 or above. It is not necessary for Computer Science to have been studied at GCSE level for it to be taken at A Level. However, students need at least 5 GCSEs at Grade 4 or above including Maths and English at Grade 6 or above.
Level 3 WJEC Criminology	GCSE Grade 5 or above in English Language or English Literature.
Drama	GCSE Grade 6 in Drama. Those who have not studied GCSE Drama will be considered, but must have achieved a Grade 6 or above in English Literature and be able to demonstrate passion or experience.
English Language	GCSE Grade 6 or above in English Language, but recommended Grade 7. At the start of the year, all students will sit a 'Head Start Test' to establish a baseline for progress monitoring and to confirm they meet the course requirements.
English Literature	GCSE Grade 6 or above in English Literature, but recommended grade 7. At the start of the year, all students will sit a 'Head Start Test' to establish a baseline for progress monitoring and to confirm they meet the course requirements.
Level 3 WJEC Food Science & Nutrition	Grade 5 in GCSE Food Preparation and Nutrition (if studied) and Grade 5 in GCSE Science. Students who have not studied Food at GCSE will be considered if they can demonstrate they have a real passion and commitment to the subject.
French	The A Level course is aimed at students who have gained a Grade 7 in GCSE French.
Geography	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Geography and a Grade 6 in English Language or Literature.
German	The A Level course is aimed at students who have gained a Grade 7 in GCSE German.
Graphics	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Graphics or Art or Photography; Grade 5 or above in English.
Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification (AAQ) in Health & Social Care	As per the Sixth Form general entry criteria, students must achieve the minimum requirements of at least five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including both English & Maths.
History	GCSE Grade 6 or above in History. Students who have not studied History at GCSE will be considered if they have a Grade 5 in English Language.
Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification (AAQ) in Information Technology	A Merit at OCR Cambridge nationals' level 2 if previously studied. As per the Sixth Form general entry criteria, students must achieve the minimum requirements of at least five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including both English & Maths.
Maths	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Mathematics, having completed the full Higher GCSE course and 70% or above in the Head Start Test. We recommend a grade 7 at GCSE.
Further Maths	GCSE Grade 7 in Mathematics (higher level) and 85% or above in the Head Start September assessment.
Media Studies	GCSE Grade 6 in Media Studies or Grade 6 in English Language or English Literature. A portfolio of work & discussion with the Head of Department if not studied before.
Music Level 3 *Course Exam board TBC	GCSE Grade 5 or above in Music. Performance audition and music theory test will be used as a replacement for GCSE Music if not studied at GCSE.

Philosophy and Ethics (RE)	A GCSE in English Language or Literature at Grade 6 is required. A GCSE Grade 6 in Religious Studies is preferred but not essential.
Photography	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Photography or Art and Grade 5 or above in English. If you do not meet the criteria, application may be considered on an individual basis through the submission of a portfolio of work and Head of Department discussion.
Physical Education	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Physical Education. Students must be playing one sport on a regular basis at a competitive club standard (equivalent) or above. The PE Department will need to be consulted on this prior to the course commencing to check eligibility for the practical element. Grade 5 or above in both Science and English.
Physics	Separate Science: Students must have a Grade 7 in the Science they wish to study with at least a Grade 6 in the others. Students must have a Grade 6 in Mathematics. Combined Science: Students must have a Grade 7,7 in Combined Science with at least a Grade 6 in Mathematics. At the start of the year, all students will sit a 'Head Start Test' to establish a baseline for progress monitoring and to confirm they meet the course requirements.
Politics	Grade 5 or above in History GCSE or Grade 6 in English Literature/English Language GCSE.
Product Design	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Design and Technology options of resistant materials, graphic products or product design. Students studying Engineering will require a L2 Distinction. In addition, students will require grades 5 or above in Mathematics and English.
Psychology	GCSE Grade 6 or above in English Language or Literature, Grade 6 in Mathematics and Grade 6 in Science (Biology preferred).
Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification (AAQ) in Applied Science	Grade 55 in Combined Science, or grade 5 in all three separate sciences.
Sociology	GCSE Grade 6 or above in English Language or English Literature.
Level 3 BTEC Sport	BTEC Sport or CNAT Level 2 at Grade Merit or above. GCSE PE at Grade 5 or above. Grade 4 or above in English.
Spanish	The A Level course is aimed at students who have gained a Grade 7 in GCSE Spanish.
Textiles	GCSE Grade 6 or above in Design and Technology (Textiles specialism) or Art and Design plus a Grade 5 or above in English.
