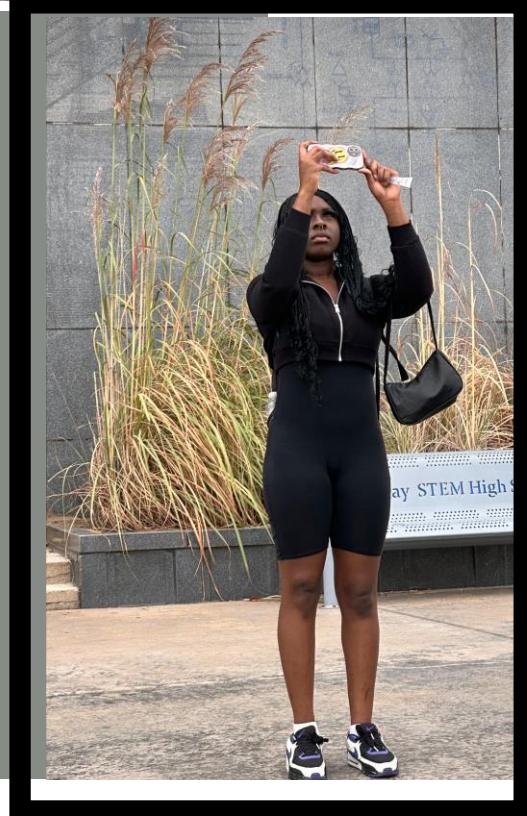


Remember the Sky

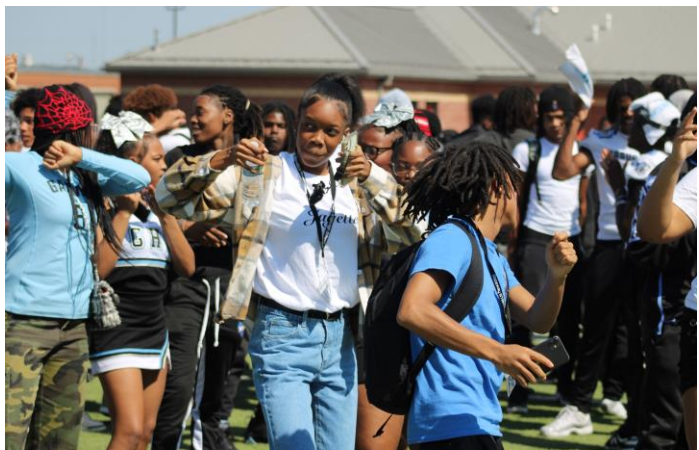
